CHRONICLES.

THE two books of Chronicles (like the two books of Kings) are but one book in the Together they cover the period from the death of Saul to the cap-Jewish canon. tivities. They were written probably during the Babylonian captivity, and are distinguished from the two books of the Kings in a fuller account of Judah, and in the omission of many details. The blessing of God's earthly people in connection with the Davidic monarchy is probably the typical significance of these books.

First Chronicles is in three parts: I. Official genealogies, 1. 1–9. 44. II. From the death of Saul to the accession of David, 10. 1–12. 40. III. From the accession

of David to his death, 13. 1-29. 30.

Excluding the genealogies (ch. 1.-9.) the events recorded in First Chronicles cover a period of 41 years (Ussher).

23 So they and their children had the oversight of the gates of the house of the LORD, namely, the house of the tabernacle, by wards.

24 In four quarters were the porters, toward the east, west, north,

and south.

25 And their brethren, which were in their villages, were to come after gseven days from time to time with them.

The charge of certain Levites.

26 For these Levites, the four chief porters, were in their set office, and were over the hchambers and treasuries of the house of God.

27 And they lodged round about the house of God, because the charge was upon them, and the opening thereof every morning pertained to them.

28 And certain of them had the charge of the ministering vessels, that they should bring them in and

out by tale.

29 Some of them also were appointed to oversee the vessels, and all the instruments of the sanctuary. and the fine flour, and the wine, and the oil, and the frankincense, and the spices.

30 And some of the sons of the priests made the iointment of the

spices.

31 And Mattithiah, one of the Levites, who was the firstborn of Shallum the Korahite, had the set joffice over the things that were made in the pans.

32 And other of their brethren, of the sons of the kKohathites, were over the lshewbread, to prepare it

every sabbath.

33 And these are the msingers, chief of the fathers of the Levites, who remaining in the chambers were free: for they were employed in that work day and night.

34 These chief fathers of the Le-

vites were chief throughout their generations; these dwelt at Jeru-

salem.

The stock of Saul and Jonathan.

35 And in Gibeon dwelt the father of Gibeon, Jehiel, whose wife's name was "Maachah:

36 And his firstborn son Abdon, then Zur, and Kish, and Baal, and Ner, and Nadab,

37 And Gedor, and Ahio, and Zechariah, and Mikloth.

38 And Mikloth begat Shimeam. And they also dwelt with their brethren at Jerusalem, over against their brethren.

39 And aNer begat Kish; and Kish begat Saul; and Saul begat Jonathan, and Malchi-shua, and Abinadab, and Esh-baal.

40 And the son of Jonathan was Merib-baal: and Merib-baal begat

Micah.

41 And the sons of Micah were, Pithon, and Melech, and Tahrea,

band Ahaz.

42 And Ahaz begat Jarah; and Jarah begat Alemeth, and Azmaveth, and Zimri; and Zimri begat Moza:

43 And Moza begat Binea; and b Added from Rephaiah his son, Eleasah his son,

Azel his son.

44 And Azel had six sons, whose names are these, Azrikam, Bocheru. and Ishmael, and Sheariah, and Obadiah, and Hanan: these were the sons of Azel.

CHAPTER 10.

Saul's overthrow and death.

Now the Philistines fought against Israel; and the men of Israel fled from before the Philistines, and fell down slain in mount Gilboa.

2 And the Philistines followed hard after Saul, and after his sons; and the Philistines slew Jonathan, and dAbinadab, and Malchi-shua, j 2 Sam.5.1, the sons of Saul.

3 And the battle went sore against Saul, and the archers hit him, and k 1 Sam. 16. he was wounded of the archers.

4 Then said Saul to his armourbearer, Draw thy sword, and thrust 1 Cf.1 Sam. me through therewith; lest these uncircumcised come and abuse me. But his armourbearer would not; for he was sore afraid. So Saul took a sword, and fell upon it.

5 And when his armourbearer saw that Saul was dead, he fell likewise on the sword, and died.

6 So Saul died, and his three sons, and all his house died to-

gether.

7 And when all the men of Israel that were in the valley saw that they fled, and that Saul and his sons were dead, then they forsook their cities, and fled: and the Philistines came and dwelt in them.

8 And it came to pass on the morrow, when the Philistines came to strip the slain, that they found Saul and his sons fallen in mount Gilboa.

9 And when they had stripped him, they ftook his head, and his armour, and sent into the land of the Philistines round about to carry tidings unto their idols, and to the people.

10 And they put his armour in the house of their gods, and fastened his head in the temple of Dagon.

The kindness of Jabesh-gilead toward Saul and his sons.

11 And gwhen all Jabesh-gilead heard all that the Philistines had done to Saul,

12 They arose, all the valiant men, and took away the body of Saul, and the bodies of his sons, and brought them to Jabesh, and buried their bones under the oak in Jabesh, and fasted seven days.

Saul's sin for which he lost the kingdom.

13 So Saul died for his htransgression which he committed against the LORD, even against the word of the LORD, which he kept not, and ialso for asking counsel of one that had a familiar spirit, to enquire of it;

14 And enquired not of the LORD: therefore he slew him, and turned the kingdom unto David the son of

Jesse.

CHAPTER 11.

David becomes king over Israel (2 Sam. 5. 1-3).

HEN all Israel jgathered themselves to David unto Hebron, saying, Behold, we are thy bone and thy flesh.

2 And moreover in time past, even when Saul was king, thou wast he that leddest out and broughtest in Israel: and the LORD thy *God said unto thee, Thou shalt feed my peo-

ple Israel, and thou shalt be ruler over my people Israel.

3 Therefore came all the elders of Israel to the king to Hebron; and David made a covenant with them in Hebron before the LORD; and they lanointed David king over Israel, according to the word of the LORD by Samuel.

Jerusalem made the capital of the united kingdom (2 Sam. 5. 6-12).

4 And David and all Israel went to Jerusalem, which is aJebus; where the Jebusites were, the inhabitants

of the land.

5 And the inhabitants of Jebus said to David, Thou shalt not come hither. Nevertheless David took the bcastle of 1Zion, which is the city of David.

6 And David said, Whosoever smiteth the Jebusites first shall be chief and captain. So Joab the son of Zeruiah went first up, and was chief.

7 And David dwelt in the castle: therefore they called it the city of

David.

8 And he built the city round about, a Cf. Jud. 1. even from Millo round about: and Joab repaired the rest of the city.

9 So David waxed greater and greater: for the LORD of hosts was See v.5. with him.

A catalogue of David's mighty

10 dThese also are the chief of the mighty men whom David had, who strengthened themselves with him f One cubit = about 18 in. in his kingdom, and with all Israel, to make him king, according to the word of the LORD concerning Israel.

11 And this is the number of the mighty men whom David had; Jashobeam, an Hachmonite, the chief of the captains: he lifted up his spear against three hundred slain by him at one time.

12 And after him was Eleazar the son of Dodo, the Ahohite, who was

one of the three mighties.

13 He was with David at Pas-dammim, and there the Philistines were gathered together to battle, where was a parcel of ground full of barley; and the people fled from before the Philistines.

14 And they set themselves in the midst of that parcel, and delivered it, and slew the Philistines; and the LORD saved them by a great deliv-

erance.

15 Now ethree of the thirty cap-

tains went down to the rock to David, into the cave of Adullam; and the host of the Philistines encamped in the valley of Rephaim.

16 And David was then in the hold, and the Philistines' garrison

was then at Beth-lehem.

17 And David longed, and said. Oh that one would give me drink of the water of the well of Bethlehem, that is at the gate!

18 And the three brake through the host of the Philistines, and drew water out of the well of Beth-lehem. that was by the gate, and took it. and brought it to David: but David would not drink of it, but poured it

out to the LORD,

19 And said, My God forbid it me, that I should do this thing; shall I drink the blood of these men that have put their lives in jeopardy? for with the jeopardy of their lives they brought it. Therefore he would not drink it. These things did these three mightiest.

20 And Abishai the brother of Joab, he was chief of the three: for lifting up his spear against three hundred, he slew them, and had a

name among the three.

21 Of the three, he was more honourable than the two; for he was their captain: howbeit he attained not to the first three.

22 Benaiah the son of Jehoiada, the son of a valiant man of Kabzeel, who had done many acts; he slew two lionlike men of Moab: also he went down and slew a lion in a

pit in a snowy day.

23 And he slew an Egyptian, a man of great stature, five fcubits high: and in the Egyptian's hand was a spear like a weaver's beam; and he went down to him with a staff, and plucked the spear out of the Egyptian's hand, and slew him with his own spear.

24 These things did Benaiah the

son of Jehoiada, and had the name

among the three mighties.

25 Behold, he was honourable among the thirty, but attained not to the first three: and David set him over his guard.

CHAPTER 12.

The companies that came to David at Ziklag.

NOW these are they that came to David to aZiklag, while he yet kept himself close because of Saul the son of Kish: and they were among the mighty men, helpers of the war.

2 They were armed with bows. and could use both the right hand and the left bin hurling stones and shooting arrows out of a bow, even of Saul's brethren of Benjamin.

3 The chief was Ahiezer, then Joash, the sons of Shemaah the Gibeathite; and Jeziel, and Pelet, the sons of Azmaveth; and Berachah, and Jehu the Antothite,

4 And Ismaiah the Gibeonite, a mighty man among the thirty, and over the thirty; and Jeremiah, and Jahaziel, and Johanan, and Josabad the Gederathite.

5 Eluzai, and Jerimoth, and Bealiah, and Shemariah, and Shepha-

tiah the Haruphite,

6 Elkanah, and Jesiah, and Azareel, and Joezer, and Jashobeam, the Korhites.

7 And Joelah, and Zebadiah, the

sons of Jeroham of Gedor.

(In the order of the history 1 Chr. 12. 8-15 follows 2 Sam. 5. 17: 1 Chr. 14, 8.)

8 And of the Gadites there separated themselves unto David into the hold to the wilderness men of might, and men of war fit for the battle, that could handle shield and buckler, whose faces were like the faces of lions, and were as swift as the roes upon the mountains;

9 Ezer the first, Obadiah the sec-

ond, Eliab the third.

10 Mishmannah the fourth, Jeremiah the fifth. 11 Attai the sixth, Eliel the sev-

enth,

12 Johanan the eighth, Elzabad the ninth.

13 Jeremiah the tenth, Machbanai the eleventh.

14 These were of the sons of Gad, captains of the host: one of the least was over an hundred, and the

greatest over a thousand. 15 These are they that went over

Jordan in the first month, when it had overflown all his banks; and they put to flight all them of the valleys, both toward the east, and toward the west.

16 And there came of the children of Benjamin and Judah to the hold

unto David.

17 And David went out to meet them, and answered and said unto them, If ye be come peaceably unto me to help me, mine heart shall be knit unto you: but if ye be come to betray me to mine enemies, seeing there is no wrong in mine hands,

19 And there fell some of Manasseh to David, when he came with the Philistines against Saul to battle: but they helped them not: for the lords of the Philistines upon advisement sent him away, dsaying, He will fall to his master Saul to the jeopardy of our heads.

20 As he went to Ziklag, there fell a Holy Spirit. to him of Manasseh, Adnah, and Jozabad, and Jediael, and Michael, and Jozabad, and Elihu, and Zilthai, captains of the thousands that were b 2 Sam. 17.25,

of Manasseh.

21 And they chelped David against the band of the rovers: for they were all mighty men of valour, and d 1 Sam. 29.4. were captains in the host.

22 For at that time day by day e 1 Sam.30. there came to David to help him, until it was a great host, like the f2 Sam.2.1-4; host of God.

The men of Israel who made David king. (Cf. 2 Sam. 5, 1-3.)

23 And these are the numbers of h 2 Sam.8.17. the bands that were ready armed i 2 Sam. 2.4-7. to the war, and came to David fto Hebron, to turn the kingdom of j See 1 Ki.8.61. Saul to him. gaccording to the word & Cf.2 Sam. of the LORD.

24 The children of Judah that bare shield and spear were six thousand and eight hundred, ready armed to

the war.

25 Of the children of Simeon, mighty men of valour for the war. seven thousand and one hundred.

26 Of the children of Levi four

thousand and six hundred.

27 And Jehoiada was the leader of the Aaronites, and with him were three thousand and seven hundred;

28 And hZadok, a young man mighty of valour, and of his father's house twenty and two captains.

29 And of the children of Benjamin, the kindred of Saul, three thousand: for hitherto the greatest part of them had ikept the ward of the house of Saul.

30 And of the children of Ephraim twenty thousand and eight hundred, mighty men of valour, faB.C. 1058.

32 And of the children of Issachar, which were men that had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do; the heads of them were two hundred; and all their brethren were at their commandment.

33 Of Zebulun, such as went forth to battle, expert in war, with all instruments of war, fifty thousand, which could keep rank: they were

not of double heart.

34 And of Naphtali a thousand captains, and with them with shield and spear thirty and seven thousand.

35 And of the Danites expert in war twenty and eight thousand and six hundred.

36 And of Asher, such as went forth to battle, expert in war, forty

thousand.

37 And on the other side of Jordan, of the Reubenites, and the Gadites, and of the half tribe of Manasseh, with all manner of instruments of war for the battle, an hundred and twenty thousand.

38 All these men of war, that could keep rank, came with a ^jper-fect heart to Hebron, to make David king over all Israel: and all the rest also of Israel were of one

heart to make David king.

39 And there they were with David three days, eating and drinking: for their brethren had pre-

pared for them.

40 Moreover they that were nigh them, even unto Issachar and Zebulun and Naphtali, brought bread on asses, and on camels, and on mules, and on oxen, and meat, meal, cakes of figs, and bunches of raisins, and wine, and oil, and oxen, and sheep abundantly: for there was joy in Israel.

CHAPTER 13.

Doing a right thing in the wrong way.

A ND David consulted with the captains of thousands and hundreds, and with every leader.

2 And ^kDavid said unto all the

congregation of Israel, If it seem good unto you, and that it be of the LORD our God, let us send abroad

unto our brethren every where, that are left in all the land of Israel, and with them also to the priests and Levites which are in their cities and suburbs, that they may gather themselves unto us:

3 And let us bring again the ark of our God to us: for we enquired

not at it in the days of Saul.

4 And all the congregation said that they would do so: for the thing was right in the eyes of all the

5 So David gathered all Israel together, from Shihor of Egypt even unto the entering of Hemath, to bring the ark of God from a 1 Sam. 6.1-

6 And David went up, and all b Josh 15.9, Israel, to bBaalah, that is, to Kirjath-jearim, which belonged to Judah, to bring up thence the ark of God the LORD, that dwelleth d Cf. Num. 4. between the cherubims, whosename is called on it.

7 And they dcarried the ark of e Called God in a new cart out of the house of Abinadab: and Uzza and Ahio

drave the cart.

Uzza being smitten, the ark is left at the house of Obed- j 2 Sam.5.11, edom.

9 And when they came unto the threshingfloor of Chidon, Uzza put forth his hand to hold the ark; for the oxen stumbled.

10 And the anger of the LORD was kindled against Uzza, and he smote m 2 Sam.5. him, because he put his hand to the ark: and there he died before God.

11 And David was displeased, because the LORD had made a breach upon Uzza: wherefore that place is

called Perez-uzza to this day. 12 And David was afraid of God that day, saying, How shall I bring the ark of God home to me?

13 So David brought not the ark home to himself to the city of David, but carried it aside into the house of Obed-edom the Gittite.

14 And the ark of God hremained with the family of Obed-edom in his house three months. And the LORD iblessed the house of Obededom, and all that he had.

CHAPTER 14.

The prosperity of King David.

NOW Hiram king of Tyre sent messengers to David, and timber of cedars, with masons and carpenters, to build him an house.

2 And David perceived that the LORD had confirmed him king over Israel, for his kingdom was lifted up on high, because of his people Israel.

3 And David took more wives at Jerusalem: and David begat more

sons and daughters.

4 Now these are the names of his children which he had in Jerusalem; Shammua, and Shobab, Nathan, and Solomon,

5 And Ibhar, and Elishua, and

Elpalet.

6 And Nogah, and Nepheg, and Japhia. 7 And Elishama, and *Beeliada,

and Eliphalet.

8 And lwhen the Philistines heard that David was anointed king over all Israel, all the Philistines went up to seek David. And David heard of it, and went out against them.

9 And the Philistines came and spread themselves in the valley of

Rephaim.

10 And David enquired of God, i 1 Chr.26.4-8. saying, Shall I go up against the Philistines? and wilt thou deliver them into mine hand? And the LORD said unto him, Go up; for I k Called Eliwill deliver them into thine hand. ada, 2 Sam.

11 So they came up to Baal-perazim; and David smote them there. Then David said, God hath broken in upon mine enemies by mine hand like the breaking forth of waters: therefore they called the name of that place Baal-perazim.

12 And when they had left their gods there, David gave a commandment, and they were burned with

fire.

13 mAnd the Philistines yet again spread themselves abroad in the

valley.

14 Therefore David enquired again of God; and God said unto him, Go not up after them; turn away from them, and come upon them over against the mulberry trees.

15 And it shall be, when thou shalt hear a sound of going in the tops of the mulberry trees, that then thou shalt go out to battle: for God is gone forth before thee to smite the host of the Philistines.

16 David therefore did as God commanded him: and they smote the host of the Philistines from aGibeon even to Gazer.

17 And the fame of David went out into all lands; and the LORD brought the bfear of him upon all

nations.

CHAPTER 15.

Doing a right thing in the right way. (Cf. 1 Chr. 13.)

ND David made him houses in A the city of David, and oprepared a place for the ark of God,

and pitched for it a tent.

2 Then David said. dNone ought to carry the ark of God but the Levites: a Called Geba, for ethem hath the LORD chosen to carry the ark of God, and to minis- b Cf. Deut. ter unto him for ever.

3 fAnd David gathered all Israel together to Jerusalem, to bring up c 1 Chr. 16.1. the ark of the LORD unto his place, which he had prepared for it.

4 And David assembled the children of Aaron, and the Levites:

5 Of the sons of Kohath; Uriel the chief, and his brethren an hundred and twenty:

6 Of the sons of Merari; Asaiah the chief, and his brethren two gi.e. separate.

hundred and twenty:

7 Of the sons of Gershom; Joel the chief, and his brethren an hundred and thirty:

8 Of the sons of Elizaphan; She- h 1 Chr. 13.7maiah the chief, and his brethren two hundred:

9 Of the sons of Hebron; Eliel the chief, and his brethren fourscore:

10 Of the sons of Uzziel; Amminadab the chief, and his brethren an

hundred and twelve.

11 And David called for Zadok and Abiathar the priests, and for the Levites, for Uriel, Asaiah, and Joel, Shemaiah, and Eliel, and Amminadab,

12 And said unto them, Ye are the chief of the fathers of the Levites: gsanctify yourselves, both ye and your brethren, that ye may bring up the ark of the LORD God of Israel unto the place that I have prepared for it.

13 For hbecause ye did it not at the first, the LORD our God made a breach upon us, for that we sought

him not after the due order.

14 So the priests and the Levites sanctified themselves to bring up the ark of the LORD God of Israel. 15 And the children of the Levites B.C. 1045.

bare the ark of God upon their shoulders with the staves thereon, as Moses commanded according to the word of the LORD.

16 And David spake to the chief of the Levites to appoint their brethren to be the singers with instruments of musick, psalteries and harps and cymbals, sounding, by lifting up the voice with joy.

17 So the Levites appointed Heman the son of Joel; and of his brethren, Asaph the son of Berechiah; and of the sons of Merari their brethren, Ethan the son of

Kushaiah;

18 And with them their brethren of the second degree, Zechariah, Ben, and Jaaziel, and Shemiramoth, and Jehiel, and Unni, Eliab, and Benaiah, and Maaseiah, and Mattithiah, and Elipheleh, and Mikneiah. and Obed-edom, and Jeiel, the porters.

19 So the singers, Heman, Asaph, and Ethan, were appointed to sound with cymbals of brass;

iAziel, 20 And Zechariah, and and Shemiramoth, and Jehiel, and Unni, and Eliab, and Maaseiah, and Benaiah, with psalteries on Alamoth:

21 And Mattithiah, and Elipheleh, and Mikneiah, and Obededom, and Jeiel, and Azaziah, with harps on the Sheminith to excel.

22 And Chenaniah, chief of the Levites, was for song: he instructed about the song, because he was skilful.

23 And Berechiah and Elkanah were doorkeepers for the ark.

24 And Shebaniah, and Jehoshaphat, and Nethaneel, and Amasai, and Zechariah, and Benaiah, and Eliezer, the priests, did blow with the trumpets before the ark of God: and jObed-edom and Jehiah were doorkeepers for the ark.

David brings up the ark (2 Sam. 6. 12-23).

25 kSo David, and the elders of Israel, and the captains over thousands, went to bring up the ark of the covenant of the LORD out of the house of Obed-edom with joy.

26 And it came to pass, when God helped the Levites that bare the ark of the covenant of the LORD, that they offered seven bullocks and seven rams.

27 And David was clothed with a robe of fine linen, and all the Levites that bare the ark, and the singers, and Chenaniah the master of the song with the singers: David also had upon him an ephod of linen.

28 Thus all Israel brought up the ark of the covenant of the LORD with bshouting, and with sound of the cornet, and with trumpets, and with cymbals, making a noise with psalteries and harps.

29 And it came to pass, as the ark of the covenant of the LORD came a 1 Chr.13.8. to the city of David, that Michal the daughter of Saul looking out at b Num.23.21; a window saw king David dancing and playing: and she despised him in her heart.

6 Benaiah also and Jahaziel the priests with trumpets continually before the ark of the covenant of God.

7 Then on that day David delivered first this psalm to thank the LORD into the hand of Asaph and his brethren.

8 Give thanks unto the LORD. call upon his name, make known his deeds among the people.

38 And Obed-edom with their brethren, threescore and eight; Obed-edom also the son of Jeduthun and Hosah to be porters:

39 And Zadok the priest, and his brethren the priests, before the tabernacle of the LORD in the high

place that was at Gibeon.

40 To offer burnt-offerings unto the LORD upon the altar of the burnt-offering continually morning and evening, and to do according to all that is written in the law of the LORD, which he commanded Israel:

41 And with them Heman and Jeduthun, and the rest that were chosen, who were expressed by name, to give thanks to the LORD, because his mercy endureth for

ever;

David's desire to build the Lord's house (2 Sam. 7. 1-3).

NOW it came to pass, as David sat in his house, that David said to Nathan the prophet, Lo, I dwell in an house of hcedars, but the ark of the covenant of the LORD remaineth under curtains.

2 Then Nathan isaid unto David. Do all that is in thine heart; for 12; Ezra 2. 41. Writer of

God is with thee.

3 And it came to pass the same night, that the word of God came to Nathan, saying,
4 Go and tell David my servant,

Thus saith the LORD, Thou shalt not build me an house to dwell in: 5 For I have not dwelt in an house

since the day that I brought up Israel unto this day; but have gone from tent to tent, and from one tabernacle to another.

6 Wheresoever I have walked with all Israel, spake I a word to any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to feed my people, saying, Why have ye not built me an house of cedars?

The great Davidic Covenant (2 Sam. 7. 4-17, note).

7 Now therefore thus shalt thou say unto my servant David, Thus saith the LORD of hosts. I took thee jfrom the sheepcote, even ²from following the sheep, that thou shouldest be ruler over my people Israel:

8 And I have been with thee whithersoever thou hast walked, and have cut off all thine enemies from before thee, and have made thee a name like the name of the great men that are in the earth.

It will be understood that the ancient tabernacle was now divided; the ark was brought into "Zion" (1 Chr. 11. 5, note), while the brazen altar, at least, and probably the vessels of the holy place (Ex. 25. 23-40; 37. 10-25; 40. 22-27) were established in the high place at Gibeon. Asaph and the singers (1 Chr. 6. 31-39; 15. 16-19; 16. 5; 25. 6) were "left before the ark" (1 Chr. 16. 37), while the priests ministered in Gibeon "before the tabernacle" (1 Chr. 16. 39). All this was mere confusion: cf. Heb. 9. 1-7. With the construction of the temple the divine order seems to have been restored.

16 And when the Syrians saw that 6 2 Sam.21.20. they were put to the worse before for, Sham-Israel, they sent messengers, and drew forth the Syrians that were beyond the river: and Shophach the g Satan, Job captain of the host of Hadarezer went before them.

17 And it was told David; and he gathered all Israel, and passed over Jordan, and came upon them, and j Cf.1 Chr.27. set the battle in array against them. So when David had put the battle in array against the Syrians, they fought with him.

18 But the Syrians fled before Is-

rael; and David slew of the Syrians seven thousand men which fought in chariots, and forty thousand footmen, and killed Shophach the

captain of the host.

19 And when the servants of Hadarezer saw that they were put to the worse before Israel, they made peace with David, and became his servants: neither would the Syrians help the children of Ammon any more.

2 And David took the crown of their king from off his head, and found it to weigh a ctalent of gold. and there were precious stones in it; and it was set upon David's head: and he brought also exceeding much spoil out of the city.

vid. 5 And David fsaid, Solomon my son is young and tender, and the house that is to be builded for the LORD must be exceeding magnifical, of fame and of glory throughout all countries: I will therefore now make preparation for it. So David prepared abundantly before his death.

He instructs Solomon in God's promises, and his duty in building the temple.

6 Then he called for Solomon his son, and charged him to build an house for the LORD God of Israel.

7 And David said to Solomon, My son, as for me, git was in my mind to build an house unto the name of

the LORD my God:

8 But the word of the LORD came to me, hsaying, Thou hast shed blood abundantly, and hast made great wars: thou shalt not build an house unto my name, because thou hast shed much blood upon the earth in my sight.

9 Behold, a son shall be born to thee, who shall be a man of rest; and I will give him rest from all his enemies round about: for his name shall be Solomon, and I will give peace and quietness unto Israel note; 1 Ki.3. 4; 2 Chr.1.3. in his days.

> 10 jHe shall build an house for my name; and he shall be my son, and I will be his father; and I will establish the throne of his kingdom

> with thee; and prosper thou, and build the house of the LORD thy God, as he hath said of thee.

> 12 Only the LORD give thee kwisdom and understanding, and give thee charge concerning Israel, that thou mayest keep the law of the LORD thy God.

> 13 Then shalt thou prosper, if dread not, nor be dismayed.

> 14 Now, behold, in my trouble I have prepared for the house of the LORD an hundred thousand talents of gold, and a thousand thousand talents of silver; and of brass and iron without weight; for it is in abundance: timber also and stone have I prepared; and thou mayest add thereto.

15 Moreover there are workmen with thee in abundance, hewers and workers of stone and timber,

thou takest heed to fulfil the statutes and judgments which the LORD charged Moses with concerning Israel: be strong, and of good courage;

18 Is not the LORD your God with you? and hath he not given you rest on every side? for he hath given the inhabitants of the land into mine hand; and the land is subdued before the LORD, and before his people.

19 Now set your heart and your soul to seek the LORD your God; arise therefore, and build ye the a 1 Ki.8.1-10; sanctuary of the LORD God, to abring the ark of the covenant of b 1 Ki.1.33-40; the LORD, and the holy vessels of God, into the house that is to be built to the name of the LORD.

CHAPTER 23.

David in his old age makes Solomon king.

SO when David was old and full B.C. 1015.] of days, he bmade Solomon his f Called Zizah, son king over Israel.

The number and distribution of the Levites.

2 And he gathered together all the princes of Israel, with the priests and the Levites.

3 Now the Levites were numbered from the cage of thirty years and upward: and their number by their polls, man by man, was thirty and eight thousand.

4 Of which, twenty and four thousand were to set forward the work of the house of the LORD; and six thousand were officers and djudges:

5 Moreover four thousand were porters; and four thousand praised the LORD with the instruments which I made, said David, to praise therewith.

6 And David divided them into courses among the sons of Levi, namely, Gershon, Kohath, and

Merari.

The families of the Gershonites. (Cf. Num. 3. 25, 26.)

7 Of the Gershonites were. Laadan. and Shimei.

8 The sons of Laadan; the chief

9 The sons of Shimei; Shelomith, and Haziel, and Haran, three, These were the chief of the fathers of Laadan.

10 And the sons of Shimei were, Jahath, JZina, and Jeush, and Be-These four were the sons of riah.

Shimei.

11 And Jahath was the chief, and Zizah the second: but Jeush and Beriah had not many sons; therefore they were in one reckoning. according to their father's house.

The sons of Kohath. (Cf. Num. 3. 27-31.)

12 The sons of Kohath: Amram. Izhar, Hebron, and Uzziel, four.

13 The sons of gAmram; Aaron and Moses: and hAaron was separated, that he should sanctify the most holy things, he and his sons for ever, to burn incense before the LORD, to minister unto him, and to bless in his name for ever.

14 Now concerning Moses the man of God, his sons were named

of the tribe of Levi.

15 The sons of Moses were, Gershom, and Eliezer.

16 Of the sons of Gershom, Shebuel was the chief.

17 And the sons of Eliezer were. Rehabiah the chief. And Eliezer had none other sons: but the sons of Rehabiah were very many.

18 Of the sons of Izhar; Shelomith

the chief.

19 Of the sons of Hebron; Jeriah the first, Amariah the second, Jahaziel the third, and Jekameam the fourth.

20 Of the sons of Uzziel: Micah the first, and Jesiah the second.

The sons of Merari. (Cf. Num. 3. 33-37.)

21 The sons of Merari; Mahli, and Mushi. The sons of Mahli; Eleazar, and Kish.

22 And Eleazar died, and had no sons, but daughters: and their ibrethren the sons of Kish took them.

23 The sons of Mushi; Mahli, and

Eder, and Jeremoth, three.

The new office of the Levites. (Cf. Num. 3. 5-12.)

24 These were the sons of Levi after the house of their fathers; even the chief of the fathers, as they were counted by number of names by their polls, that did the work for the service of the house of the LORD, from the age of twenty years and upward.

25 For David said, The LORD God of Israel hath given rest unto his people, that they may dwell in

Jerusalem for ever:

26 And also unto the Levites; they shall no more carry the tabernacle, nor any vessels of it for the service thereof.

27 For by the last words of David the Levites were numbered from twenty years old and above:

28 Because their aoffice was to wait on the sons of Aaron for the service of the house of the LORD, in the courts, and in the chambers, and in the purifying of all holy things, a i.e. their and the work of the service of the house of God:

29 Both for the bshewbread, and for the fine flour for meat-offering. and for the unleavened cakes, and for that which is baked in the pan, and for that which is fried, and for all manner of measure and size:

30 And to stand every morning to c Lit. meal. thank and praise the LORD, and d Lev.10.1-6;

likewise at even;

31 And to offer all burnt-sacrifices unto the LORD in the sabbaths, in the new moons, and on the set feasts, by number, according to the order commanded unto them, continually before the LORD:

32 And that they should keep the charge of the tabernacle of the congregation, and the charge of the holy place, and the charge of the sons of Aaron their brethren, in the service of the house of the LORD.

CHAPTER 24.

The divisions of the sons of Aaron by lot into four and twenty orders.

TOW these are the divisions of the sons of Aaron. The dsons of Aaron; Nadab, and Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar.

2 But Nadab and Abihu died before their father, and had no children: therefore Eleazar and Ithamar

executed the priest's office.

3 And David distributed them. both Zadok of the sons of Eleazar, and Ahimelech of the sons of Ithamar, according to their offices in their service.

4 And there were more chief men found of the sons of Eleazar than of the sons of Ithamar; and thus were B.C. 1015.

they divided. Among the sons of Eleazar there were sixteen chief men of the house of their fathers, and eight among the sons of Ithamar according to the house of their fathers.

The four and twenty orders.

5 Thus were they divided by lot, one sort with another; for the governors of the sanctuary, and governors of the house of God, were of the sons of Eleazar, and of the sons of Ithamar.

6 And Shemaiah the son of Nethaneel the scribe, one of the Levites. wrote them before the king, and the princes, and Zadok the priest, and Ahimelech the son of Abiathar, and before the chief of the fathers of the priests and Levites: one principal household being taken for Eleazar and one taken for Ithamar.

7 Now the first lot came forth to Jehoiarib, the second to Jedaiah.

8 The third to Harim, the fourth to Seorim. 9 The fifth to Malchijah, the sixth

to Mijamin, 10 The seventh to Hakkoz, the

eighth to fAbijah,

11 The ninth to Jeshuah, the tenth to Shecaniah,

12 The eleventh to Eliashib, the twelfth to Jakim, 13 The thirteenth to Huppah, the

fourteenth to Jeshebeab. 14 The fifteenth to Bilgah, the

sixteenth to Immer,

15 The seventeenth to Hezir, the eighteenth to Aphses,

16 The nineteenth to Pethahiah. the twentieth to Jehezekel,

17 The one and twentieth to Jachin, the two and twentieth to Gamul.

18 The three and twentieth to Delaiah, the four and twentieth to Maaziah.

19 These were the orderings of them in their service to come into the house of the LORD, according to their manner, under Aaron their father, as the LORD God of Israel had commanded him.

The Kohathites divided.

20 And the rest of the sons of Levi were these: Of the sons of Amram; &Shubael: of the sons of Shubael: Jehdeiah.

21 Concerning Rehabiah: of the sons of Rehabiah, the first was

Isshiah.

22 Of the Izharites; Shelomoth: of the sons of Shelomoth: Jahath.

28 Of Mahli came Eleazar, who had no sons.

29 Concerning Kish: the son of Kish was Jerahmeel.

30 The sons also of Mushi: Mahli.

and Eder, and Jerimoth. These were the sons of the Levites after the house of their fathers.

31 These likewise cast lots over against their brethren the sons of Aaron in the presence of David the king, and Zadok, and Ahimelech, and the chief of the fathers of the priests and Levites, even the principal fathers over against their younger brethren.

CHAPTER 25.

The number and offices of the singers.

MOREOVER David and the captains of the host separated to the service of the sons of Asaph, and of Heman, and of Jeduthun, who should prophesy with harps, with psalteries, and with cymbals: and the number of the workmen according to their service was:

2 Of the sons of Asaph; Zaccur, and Joseph, and Nethaniah, and Asarelah, the sons of Asaph under the hands of Asaph, which prophesied according to the order of the king.

3 Of Jeduthun: the sons of Jeduthun; Gedaliah, and Zeri, and Jeshaiah, Hashabiah, and Mattithiah, six, under the hands of their father Jeduthun, who prophesied with a harp, to give thanks and to praise the LORD.

4 Of Heman: the sons of Heman; Bukkiah, Mattaniah, Uzziel, Shebuel, and Jerimoth, Hananiah, Hanani, Eliathah, Giddalti, and Romamti-ezer, Joshbekashah, Mallothi, Hothir, and Mahazioth:

5 All these were the sons of He-

man the king's seer in the words of God, to lift up the horn. And God gave to Heman fourteen sons and three daughters.

6 All these were under the hands of their father for song in the house of the LORD, with cymbals, psalteries, and harps, for the service of the house of God, according to the king's order to Asaph, Jeduthun, and Heman.

7 So the number of them, with their brethren that were instructed in the songs of the LORD, even all that were cunning, was two hundred fourscore and eight.

Their division by lot into four and twenty orders.

8 And they cast lots, ward against ward, as well the small as the great, the teacher as the scholar.

9 Now the first lot came forth for Asaph to Joseph: the second to Gedaliah, who with his brethren

20 The thirteenth to Shubael, he. his sons, and his brethren, were

21 The fourteenth to Mattithiah, he, his sons, and his brethren, were twelve:

22 The fifteenth to Jeremoth, he, his sons, and his brethren, were twelve:

23 The sixteenth to Hananiah. he, his sons, and his brethren, were twelve:

CHAPTER 26.

The division of the porters.

ONCERNING the divisions of the porters: Of the Korhites was Meshelemiah the son of Kore, of the sons of Asaph.

2 And the sons of Meshelemiah were, Zechariah the firstborn, Jediael the second, Zebadiah the third, Jathniel the fourth,

3 Elam the fifth, Jehohanan the

sixth, Elioenai the seventh.

4 Moreover, the sons of Obed-edom were, Shemaiah the firstborn, Jehozabad the second, Joah the third, and Sacar the fourth, and Nethaneel the fifth,

5 Ammiel the sixth, Issachar the seventh. Peulthai the eighth: for

God blessed him.

6 Also unto Shemaiah his son were sons born, that ruled throughout the house of their father: for they were mighty men of valour.

The sons of Shemaiah; Othni, and Rephael, and Obed, Elzabad, whose brethren were strong men,

Elihu, and Semachiah.

8 All these of the sons of Obededom: they and their sons and their brethren, able men for strength for the service, were threescore and two of Obed-edom.

9 And Meshelemiah had sons and brethren, strong men, eighteen.

10 Also Hosah, of the children of Merari, had sons; Simri the chief, (for though he was not the firstborn, yet his father made him the chief:)

11 Hilkiah the second, Tebaliah the third, Zechariah the fourth: all B.C. 1015.

the sons and brethren of Hosah were thirteen.

12 Among these were the divisions of the porters, even among the chief men, having wards one against another, to minister in the house of the LORD.

The gates assigned by lot.

13 And they cast lots, as well the small as the great, according to the house of their fathers, for every gate.

14 And the lot eastward fell to Shelemiah. Then for Zechariah his son, a wise counsellor, they cast lots; and his lot came out northward.

15 To Obed-edom southward: and to his sons the house of Asuppim.

16 To Shuppim and Hosah the lot came forth westward, with the gate Shallecheth, by the causeway of the going up, ward against ward.

17 Eastward were six Levites, northward four a day, southward four a day, and toward Asuppim

two and two.

18 At Parbar westward, four at the causeway, and two at Parbar. 19 These are the divisions of the

porters among the sons of Kore. and among the sons of Merari.

The Levites that had charge of the treasures.

20 And of the Levites, Ahijah was over the treasures of the house of God, and over the treasures of the dedicated things.

21 As concerning the sons of Laadan: the sons of the Gershonite Laadan, chief fathers, even of Laadan the Gershonite were Jehieli.

22 The sons of Jehieli; Zetham, and Joel his brother, which were over the treasures of the house of the LORD.

23 Of the Amramites, and the Izharites, the Hebronites, and the Uzzielites:

24 And Shebuel the son of Gershom, and the son of Moses, was ruler of the treasures.

25 And his brethren by Eliezer: Rehabiah his son, and Jeshaiah his son, and Joram his son, and Zichri his son, and Shelomith his son.

26 Which Shelomith and his brethren were over all the treasures of the dedicated things, which David the king, and the chief fathers, the captains over thousands and hundreds, and the captains of the host, had dedicated.

27 Out of the spoils won in battles did they dedicate to maintain the house of the LORD.

28 And all that Samuel the seer, and Saul the son of Kish, and Abner the son of Ner, and Joab the son of Zeruiah, had dedicated; and whosoever had dedicated any thing, it was under the hand of Shelomith, and of his brethren.

Officers and judges.

29 Of the Izharites, Chenaniah and his sons were for the outward business over Israel, for officers and

judges.

30 And of the Hebronites. Hashabiah and his brethren, men of valour, a thousand and seven hundred, were officers among them of Israel on this side Jordan westward in all also v. 3 the business of the LORD, and in the service of the king.

31 Among the Hebronites was Jerijah the chief, even among the Hebronites, according to the gen- die. July. erations of his fathers. In the fore i.e. August. tieth year of the reign of David they were sought for, and there fi.e. Septemwere found among them mighty men of valour at Jazer of Gilead.

32 And his brethren, men of valour, were two thousand and seven hundred chief fathers, whom king David made rulers over the Reubenites, the Gadites, and the half tribe of Manasseh, for every matter jie. January. pertaining to God, and affairs of the king.

CHAPTER 27.

The twelve captains for every several month.

NOW the children of Israel after their number, to wit, the chief fathers and captains of thousands and hundreds, and their officers that served the king in any matter of the courses, which came in and went out month by month throughout all the months of the year, of every course were twenty and four thousand.

2 Over the first course for the afirst month was Jashobeam the son of Zabdiel: and in his course were twenty and four thousand.

3 Of the children of Perez was the chief of all the captains of the host

for the first month.

And over the course of the bescond month was Dodai an Ahohite, and of his course was Mikloth also the ruler: in his course likewise were twenty and four thousand.

14 The eleventh captain for the keleventh month was Benaiah the Pirathonite, of the children Ephraim: and in his course were twenty and four thousand.

15 The twelfth captain for the twelfth month was Heldai the Netophathite, of Othniel: and in his course were twenty and four thou-

sand.

The princes of the twelve tribes.

16 Furthermore over the tribes of Israel: the ruler of the Reubenites was Eliezer the son of Zichri: of the Simeonites. Shephatiah the son of Maachah:

17 Of the Levites, Hashabiah the son of Kemuel: of the Aaronites,

Zadok:

18 Of Judah, Elihu, one of the brethren of David: of Issachar, Omri the son of Michael:

19 Of Zebulun, Ishmaiah the son

of Obadiah: of Naphtali, Jerimoth the son of Azriel:

20 Of the children of Ephraim, Hoshea the son of Azaziah: of the half tribe of Manasseh, Joel the son of Pedaiah:

21 Of the half tribe of Manasseh in Gilead. Iddo the son of Zechariah: of Benjamin, Jaasiel the son of Abner:

22 Of Dan, Azareel the son of Jeroham. These were the princes of the tribes of Israel.

25 And over the king's treasures h 1 Sam. 16. was Azmaveth the son of Adiel: and over the storehouses in the fields, in the cities, and in the villages, and in the castles, was Jehonathan the son of Uzziah:

26 And over them that did the work of the field for tillage of the k 1 Chr. 22.9. ground was Ezri the son of Chelub:

27 And over the vineyards was Shimei the Ramathite: over the increase of the vineyards for the wine cellars was Zabdi the Shiphmite:

28 And over the olive trees and the sycomore trees that were in the low plains was Baal-hanan the Gederite: and over the cellars of oil was Joash:

29 And over the herds that fed in Sharon was Shitrai the Sharonite: and over the herds that were in the valleys was Shaphat the son of

Adlai:

30 Over the camels also was Obil the Ishmaelite: and over the asses was Jehdeiah the Meronothite:

31 And over the flocks was Jaziz the Hagerite. All these were the rulers of the substance which was king David's.

32 Also Jonathan David's uncle was a counsellor, a wise man, and a scribe: and Jehiel the son of Hachmoni was with the king's sons:

33 And Ahithophel was the king's counsellor: and Hushai the Archite was the king's companion:

34 And after Ahithophel was Jehoiada the son of Benaiah, and Abiathar: and the general of the king's army was Joab.

CHAPTER 28.

David in a solemn assembly gives counsel to Israel and to Solomon.

AND David assembled all the princes of Israel, the aprinces of the tribes, and the bcaptains of the companies that ministered to the king by course, and the captains over the thousands, and captains over the hundreds, and the estewards over all the substance and possession of the king, and of his sons, with the officers, and with the dmighty men, and with all the valiant men, unto Jerusalem.

2 Then David the king stood up upon his feet, and said, Hear me, my brethren, and my people: As for me, I had in mine heart eto build an house of rest for the ark of the covenant of the LORD, and for the footstool of our God, and had made ready for the building:

3 But God gsaid unto me, Thou shalt not build an house for my name, because thou hast been a man of war, and hast shed blood.

4 Howbeit the LORD God of Israel chose me hbefore all the house of my father to be king over Israel for ever: for he hath chosen 'Judah to be the ruler; and of the house of Judah, the house of my father; and among the sons of my father he iliked me to make me king over all

5 And of all my sons, (for the LORD hath given me many sons,) he hath chosen kSolomon my son to sit upon the throne of the kingdom of the LORD over Israel.

6 And he said unto me, Solomon thy son, he shall build my house and my courts: for I have chosen him to be my son, and I will be his father.

7 Moreover I will establish his kingdom for ever, if he be constant to do my commandments and my judgments, as at this day.

8 Now therefore in the sight of all Israel the congregation of the LORD, and in the audience of our God, keep and seek for all the commandments of the LORD your God: that

18 And for the altar of incense refined gold by weight: and gold for the pattern of the chariot of the cherubims, that spread out their wings, and covered the ark of the covenant of the LORD.

19 dAll this, said David, LORD made me understand in writing by his hand upon me, even all the works of this pattern.

David encourages Solomon to build the temple.

20 And David said to Solomon his son. Be strong and of good courage. and do it: fear not, nor be dismayed: for the LORD God, even my God, will be with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee, until thou hast finished all the work for the service of the house of the LORD.

21 And, behold, the courses of the priests and the Levites, even they shall be with thee for all the service of the house of God: and there shall be with thee for all manner of workmanship every willing skilful man, for any manner of service: also the princes and all the people will

be wholly at thy commandment.

CHAPTER 29.

David exhorts the people.

FURTHERMORE David the king said unto all the congregation, Solomon my son, whom alone God hath chosen, is yet gyoung and tender, and the work is great: for the palace is not for man, but for

the LORD God.

2 Now I have prepared with all my might for the house of my God the gold for things to be made of gold, and the silver for things of silver, and the brass for things of brass, the iron for things of iron, and wood for things of wood; onyx stones, and stones to be set, glistering stones, and of divers colours. and all manner of precious stones, and marble stones in abundance.

3 Moreover, because I have set my affection to the house of my God, I have of mine own proper good, of gold and silver, which I have given to the house of my God, over and above all that I have pre-

pared for the holy house,
4 Even three thousand htalents of gold, of the gold of Ophir, and seven thousand talents of refined silver, to overlay the walls of the houses withal:

5 The gold for things of gold, and the silver for things of silver, and for all manner of work to be made by the hands of artificers. And who then is willing to consecrate his service this day unto the LORD?

The princes and people offer willingly.

6 Then the chief of the fathers and princes of the tribes of Israel, and the captains of thousands and of hundreds, with the rulers of the king's work, offered willingly,

7 And gave for the service of the a One dram = house of God of gold five thousand talents and ten thousand adrams. and of silver ten thousand talents, b Cf. Ex. 25.2; and of brass eighteen thousand talents, and one hundred thousand

talents of iron.

8 And they with whom precious stones were found gave them to the treasure of the house of the LORD, by the hand of Jehiel the Gershonite.

9 Then the people rejoiced, for that they offered bwillingly, because with eperfect heart they offered e Bible willingly to the LORD: and David the king also rejoiced with great jov.

David's thanksgiving and prayer.

10 Wherefore David dblessed the LORD before all the congregation: g Psa.39.12; and David esaid, Blessed be thou. LORD God of Israel our father, for ever and ever.

11 Thine, O LORD, is the great- h Trans. a ness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty: for all that is in the heaven and in the earth is thine; thine is the kingdom, O LORD, and thou art exalted as head above all.

12 Both riches and honour come of thee, and thou reignest over all; and in thine hand is power and might; and in thine hand it is to

make great, and to give strength unto all.

13 Now therefore, our God, we thank thee, and praise thy glorious

14 But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to offer so willingly after this sort? for all things come of thee, and of thine own have we given thee.

15 gFor we are strangers before thee, and sojourners, as were all our fathers: our days on the earth are as a shadow, and there is none abiding.

16 O LORD our God, all this store that we have prepared to build thee an house for thine holy name cometh of thine hand, and is all thine OWN

17 I know also, my God, that thou triest the heart, and hast pleasure in uprightness. As for me, in the huprightness of mine heart I have willingly offered all these things: and now have I seen with joy thy people, which are present here, to offer willingly unto thee.

18 OLORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, our fathers, keep this for ever in the imagination of the thoughts of the heart of thy people, and prepare their heart unto thee:

19 And give unto Solomon my son a iperfect heart, to keep thy commandments, thy testimonies, and thy statutes, and to do all these things, and to build the palace, for the which I have made provision.

The people, having blessed God and sacrificed, make Solomon king.

20 And David said to all the congregation, Now bless the LORD your God. And all the congregation blessed the LORD God of their fathers, and bowed down their heads, and worshipped the LORD, and the king.

21 And they sacrificed sacrifices unto the LORD, and offered burntofferings unto the LORD, on the morrow after that day, even a thousand bullocks, a thousand rams, and a thousand lambs, with their drink-offerings, and sacrifices in abundance for all Israel:

22 And did eat and drink before the LORD on that day with great gladness. And they made Solomon the son of David king the jsecond time, and anointed him unto the LORD to be the chief governor, and Zadok to be priest.

Accession of Solomon (1 Ki. 2. 12).

23 Then Solomon sat on the throne of the LORD as king instead of David his father, and prospered; and all Israel obeyed him.

24 And all the princes, and the mighty men, and all the sons likewise of king David, submitted themselves unto Solomon king.

25 And the LORD magnified Solomon exceedingly in the sight of all Israel, and bestowed upon him such royal majesty as had not been on any king before him in Israel.

Reign and death of David (1 Ki. 2. 11, 12).

26 Thus David the son of Jesse b Cf.1 Sam. reigned over all Israel.

27 And the time that he reigned over Israel was forty years; seven years reigned he in aHebron, and thirty and three years reigned he in Jerusalem.
