EZEKIEL.

EZEKIEL, like Daniel, was carried away to Babylon in the first deportation of Judah (2 Ki. 24, 11-16). Like Daniel and the Apostle John, he prophesied out of the land, and his prophecy, like theirs, follows the method of symbol and vision. Unlike the pre-exilic prophets, whose ministry was primarily to either Judah or the ten-tribe kingdom, Ezekiel is the voice of Jehovah to "the whole house of Israel."

Speaking broadly, the purpose of his ministry is to keep before the generation born in exile the national sins which had brought Israel so low (e.g. Ezk. 14. 23); to sustain the faith of the exiles by predictions of national restoration, of the execution

of justice upon their oppressors, and of national glory under the Davidic monarchy. Ezekiel is in seven great prophetic strains indicated by the expression, "The hand of the LORD was upon me" (Ezk. 1. 3; 3. 14, 22; 8. 1; 33. 22; 37. 1; 40. 1). The minor divisions are indicated by the formula, "And the word of the LORD came unto me." These divisions are indicated in the text.

The events recorded in Ezekiel cover a period of 21 years (Ussher).

PART I. EZEKIEL'S PREPARATION AND COMMISSION (SEE v. 3): CHAPTERS 1.-3. 9.

CHAPTER 1.

(1) Introduction.

NOW it came to pass in the thir-N tieth year, in the afourth month, in the fifth day of the month, as I was among the captives by the river of Chebar, that the heavens were opened, and I saw visions of God.

(2) The vision of the glory.

2 In the fifth day of the month, which was the fifth year of king

Jehoiachin's captivity,

3 The word of the LORD came expressly unto Ezekiel the priest, the son of Buzi, in the land of the Chaldeans by the river Chebar; and the chand of the LORD was there upon

a great cloud, and a fire infolding itself, and a brightness was about it, and out of the midst thereof as the colour of amber, out of the midst of the fire.

5 Also out of the midst thereof came the likeness of four living creatures. And this was their appearance; they had the likeness of

a man.

6 And every one had four faces, and every one had four wings.

7 And their feet were straight feet; and the sole of their feet was like the sole of a calf's foot: and they sparkled like the colour of burnished brass.

8 And they had the hands of a man under their wings on their four sides; and they four had their faces

and their wings.

9 Their wings were joined one to another; they turned not when they

¹ The "living creatures" are identical with the Cherubim. The subject is somewhat obscure, but from the position of the Cherubim at the gate of Eden, upon the cover of the ark of the covenant, and in Rev. 4., it is clearly gathered that they have to do with the vindication of the holiness of God as against the presumptuous pride of sinful man who, despite his sin, would "put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life" (Gen. 3. 22-24). Upon the ark of the covenant, of one substance with the mercy-seat, they saw the sprinkled blood which, in type, spake of the perfect maintenance of the divine righteousness by the sacrifice of Christ (Ex. 25. 17-20; Rom. 3. 24-26, notes). The living creatures (or Cherubim) appear to be actual beings of the angelic order. Cf. Isa. 6. 2, note. The Cherubim or living creatures are not identical with the Seraphim (Isa. 6. 2-7). They appear to have to do with the holiness of God as outraged by sin; the Seraphim with uncleanness in the people of God. The passage in Ezekiel is highly figurative, but the effect was the revelation to the prophet of the Shekinah glory of the LORD. Such revelations are connected invariably with new blessing and service. Cf. Ex. 3. 2-10; Isa. 6. 1-10; Dan. 10. 5-14; Rev. 1. 12-19.

CHAPTER 2.

(3) The filling with the Spirit.

ND he said unto me, 1Son of man, ostand upon thy feet, and I will speak unto thee.

1 "Son of man," used by our Lord of Himself seventy-nine times, is used by Jehovah ninety-one times when addressing Ezekiel. (1) In the case of our Lord the meaning is clear: it is His racial name as the representative Man in the sense of 1 Cor. 15. 45-47. The same thought, implying transcendence of mere Judaism, is involved in the phrase when applied to Ezekiel. Israel had forgotten her mission (Gen. 11. 10, note; Ezk. 5. 5-8). Now, in her captivity, Jehovah will not forsake His people, but He will remind them that they are but a small part of the race for whom He also cares. Hence the emphasis upon the word "man." The Cherubim

(4) The prophet commissioned.

ND thou, son of man, take thee A ND thou, soil of man, a sharp knife, take thee a barber's razor, eand cause it to pass upon thine head and upon thy beard: then take thee balances to weigh, and divide the hair.

2 Thou shalt burn with fire a third part in the midst of the city, when the days of the siege are fulfilled: and thou shalt take a third part, and smite about it with a knife: and a third part thou shalt scatter in the wind; and I will draw out a sword after them.

3 fThou shalt also take thereof a few in number, and bind them in

thy skirts.

4 Then take of them again, and cast them into the midst of the fire, and burn them in the fire; for thereof shall a fire come forth into all the house of Israel.

5 Thus saith the Lord God; This is Jerusalem: I have set it in the midst of the nations and countries

that are round about her.

6 And she hath changed my judgments into wickedness more than the nations, and my statutes more than the countries that are round about her: for they have refused my judgments and my statutes, they have not walked in them.

7 Therefore thus saith the Lord God: Because ye multiplied more than the nations that are round about you, and have not walked in my statutes, neither have kept my judgments, neither have done according to the judgments of the nations that are round about you;

8 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I, even I, am against thee, and will execute judgments in the midst of thee in the sight of the nations.

9 gAnd I will do in thee that which I have not done, and whereunto I will not do any more the like, because of all thine abominations.

10 Therefore the fathers shall eat the sons in the midst of thee, and the sons shall eat their fathers; and I will execute judgments in

12 A third part of thee shall die with the pestilence, and with famine shall they be consumed in the midst of thee: and a third part shall a v.12; fall by the sword round about thee; and I will scatter a third part into all the winds, and I will draw out

a sword after them.

13 Thus shall mine anger be accomplished, and I will cause my fury to rest upon them, and I will be comforted: dand they shall know that I the LORD have spoken it in my zeal, when I have accomplished d Ezk.36.6; my fury in them.

14 Moreover eI will make thee e Lev. 26.31, waste, and a reproach among the nations that are round about thee, in the sight of all that pass by.

15 So it shall be a freproach and a taunt, an instruction and an astonishment unto the nations that are round about thee, when I shall execute judgments in thee in anger and in fury and in furious rebukes. h Remnant. I the LORD have spoken it.

16 When I shall send upon them the evil arrows of famine, which shall be for their destruction, and i Ezk.21.14. which I will send to destroy you: and I will increase the famine upon j Ezk.5.12. you, and will break your staff of k Ezk.5.13.

hold, I, even I, will bring a sword upon you, and gI will destroy your

4 And your altars shall be desolate, and your images shall be broken: and gI will cast down your

slain *men* before your idols.

5 And I will lay the dead carcases of the children of Israel before their idols; and I will scatter your bones

round about your altars.

6 In all your dwellingplaces the cities shall be laid waste, and the high places shall be desolate; that your altars may be laid waste and made desolate, and your idols may be broken and cease, and your images may be cut down, and your works may be abolished.

(5) A remnant to be spared.

8 Yet will I leave a hremnant, that ye may have some that shall escape the sword among the nations, when ye shall be scattered

9 And they that escape of you shall remember me among the nations whither they shall be carried captives, because I am broken with their whorish heart, which hath departed from me, and with their eyes, which go a whoring after their idols: and they shall lothe themselves for the evils which they have committed in all their abominations.

10 And they shall know that I am the LORD, and that I have not said in vain that I would do this

evil unto them.

(6) Desolation upon the land.

11 Thus saith the Lord GoD; iSmite with thine hand, and stamp with thy foot, and say, Alas for all the evil abominations of the house of Israel! for they shall fall by the sword, by the famine, and by the pestilence.

12 He that is far off shall die of the pestilence; and he that is near shall fall by the sword; and he that remaineth and is besieged shall die by the famine: kthus will I accom-

plish my fury upon them.

13 Then shall ye know that I am the LORD, when their slain men shall be among their idols round about their altars, upon every high hill. min all the tops of the mountains, and nunder every green tree, and under every thick oak, the place where they did offer sweet

savour to all their idols.

14 So will I stretch out my hand upon them, and make the land desolate, yea, more desolate than the wilderness toward aDiblath, in all their habitations: and they shall know that I am the LORD.

CHAPTER 7.

(Part III., concluded.)

MOREOVER the word of the LORD came unto me, saying, 2 Also, thou son of man, thus saith the Lord God unto the land of Israel: bAn end, the end is come upon the four corners of the land.

3 Now is the end come upon thee. and I will send mine anger upon thee, and will judge thee according to thy ways, and will recompense upon thee all thine abominations.

4 'And mine eye shall not spare thee, neither will I have pity: but I will recompense thy ways upon thee, and thine abominations shall be in the midst of thee: dand ve shall know that I am the LORD.

5 Thus saith the Lord GoD; An evil, an only evil, behold, is come.

8 Now will I shortly pour out my fury upon thee, and accomplish j Prov.11.4; mine anger upon thee: and I will judge thee according to thy ways, kie. nations. and will recompense thee for all

thine abominations.

9 And mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity: I will recompense thee according to thy ways and thine abominations that are in the midst of thee; and ye shall know that I am the LORD that smiteth.

10 Behold the day, behold, it is come: the morning is gone forth; the rod hath blossomed, pride hath

budded.

11 Violence is risen up into a rod of wickedness: none of them shall remain, nor of their multitude, nor of any of their's: neither shall there be wailing for them.

12 fThe time is come, the day draweth near: let not the buyer

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rejoice, nor the seller mourn: for wrath is upon all the multitude thereof.

13 For the seller shall not return to that which is sold, although they were yet alive: for the vision is touching the whole multitude thereof, which shall not return; neither shall any strengthen himself in the iniquity of his life.

14 They have blown the trumpet. even to make all ready; but none goeth to the battle: for my wrath is upon all the multitude thereof.

4 And, behold, the glory of the God of Israel was there, according to the vision that I gsaw in the plain.

5 Then said he unto me, 2Son of man, lift up thine eyes now the way

7 And he brought me to the door of the court; and when I looked, behold a hole in the wall.

8 Then said he unto me, Son of man, dig now in the wall: and when I had digged in the wall, behold a door.

9 And he said unto me, Go in, and behold the wicked abominations that they do here.

10 So I went in and saw; and behold every form of creeping things, and abominable beasts, and all the idols of the house of Israel, pourtrayed upon the wall round about.

11 And there stood before them seventy men of the ancients of the house of Israel, and in the midst of them stood Jaazaniah the son of Shaphan, with every man his censer in his hand; and a thick cloud of incense went up.

1 Visions, that is, of former profanations of the temple, and of the wickedness because of which Israel was then in Babylon, shown the prophet that he might justify to the new generation born in Assyria and Babylonia during the captivity, the righteousness of God in the present national chastening. The visions are retrothe righteousness of God in the present national chastening. The visions are retrospective; Israel had done these things, hence the captivities. This strain continues to Ezk. 33. 21. It is the divine view of the national sinfulness and apostasy, revealed to Ezekiel in a series of visions so vivid that though the prophet was by the river Chebar (Ezk. 1. 1, 3; 3. 23; 10. 15, 20, 22; 43. 3) it was as if he were transported back to Jerusalem, and to the time when these things were occurring. These visions of the sinfulness of Israel are interspersed with promises of restoration and blessing which are yet to be fulfilled. See "Israel" (Gen. 12. 2, 3; Rom. 11. 26). Also "Kingdom, (O.T.)" (Gen. 1. 26-28; Zech. 12. 8).

The combined effect of the four visions of profanation in Chapter 8. is idolatry set up in the entire temple, even in the holy of holies (vs. 10, 11); women given

over to phallic cults (v. 14); and nature-worship (v. 16).

CHAPTER 9.

The vision of the slaying in Jerusalem.

HE cried also in mine ears with a loud voice, saying, Cause them that have charge over the city to draw near, even every man with destroying weapon in his hand.

4 And the LORD said unto him. ^fGo through the midst of the city. through the midst of Jerusalem, and eset a mark upon the foreheads of the men that sigh and that cry for all the abominations that be done in the midst thereof.

5 And to the others he said in mine hearing, Go ye after him through the city, and smite: let not your eye spare, neither have ye pity:

6 hSlay utterly old and young, both maids, and little children, and women: but come not near any man upon whom is the mark; and begin at my sanctuary. Then they began at the ancient men which were before the house.

7 And he said unto them, Defile the house, and fill the courts with the slain: go ye forth. And they went forth, and slew in the city.

8 And it came to pass, while they were slaying them, and I was left, that I fell upon my face, and cried, and said, Ah Lord Gop! wilt thou destroy all the residue of Israel in thy pouring out of thy fury upon Jerusalem?

9 Then said he unto me, The iniquity of the house of Israel and Judah is exceeding great, and kthe land is full of blood, and the city full of perverseness: for they say, The LORD hath forsaken the earth,

and the LORD seeth not.

10 And as for me also, mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity, but I will recompense their

way upon their head.

11 And, behold, the man clothed with linen, which had the inkhorn by his side, reported the matter, saying, I have done as thou hast commanded me.

4 Then the glory of the LORD went up from the cherub, and stood over the threshold of the house; and dthe house was filled with the cloud, d Ezk.43.5; and the court was full of the brightness of the LORD's glory.

5 And the sound of the cherubims' wings was heard even to the outer f Ezk.1.17. court, eas the voice of the Almighty

God when he speaketh.

6 And it came to pass, that when he had commanded the man clothed i Holy Spirit. with linen, saying, Take fire from between the wheels, from between the cherubims; then he went in, and stood beside the wheels.

And one cherub stretched forth his hand from between the cherubims unto the fire that was between the cherubims, and took thereof, and put it into the hands of him that was clothed with linen: who

took it, and went out.

Description of the cherubim.

8 And there appeared in the cherubims the form of a man's hand

under their wings.

9 And when I looked, behold the four wheels by the cherubims, one wheel by one cherub, and another wheel by another cherub: and the appearance of the wheels was as the colour of a beryl stone.

10 And as for their appearances. they four had one likeness, as if a wheel had been in the midst of a

wheel.

11 fWhen they went, they went upon their four sides; they turned not as they went, but to the place whither the head looked they folB.C. 594.

lowed it; they turned not as they went

12 And their whole gbody, and their backs, and their hands, and their wings, and the wheels, were full of eyes round about, even the wheels that they four had.

13 As for the wheels, it was cried unto them in my hearing, O wheel.

14 And every one had four faces: the first face was the face of a cherub, and the second face was the face of a man, and the third the face of a lion, and the fourth the face of an eagle.

15 And the cherubims were lifted hThis is the living creature that I saw by the river of Chebar.

16 And when the cherubims went. the wheels went by them: and when the cherubims lifted up their wings to mount up from the earth, the same wheels also turned not from beside them.

17 When they stood, these stood; and when they were lifted up, these lifted up themselves also: for the ispirit of the living creature was in them.

18 Then the glory of the LORD ideparted from off the threshold of the house, and stood over the cher-

19 And the cherubims lifted up their wings, and mounted up from the earth in my sight: when they went out, the wheels also were beside them, and every one stood at the door of the east gate of the LORD'S house: and the glory of the God of Israel was over them above.

20 kThis is the living creature that I saw under the God of Israel by the river of Chebar; and I knew that they were the cherubims.

21 Every one had four faces apiece, and every one four wings; and the likeness of the hands of a man was

under their wings.

22 And the likeness of their faces was the same faces which I saw by the river of Chebar, their appearances and themselves: they went every one straight forward.

CHAPTER 11.

Vision of wrath against the lying princes.

OREOVER the spirit lifted me up, and brought me unto the east gate of the LORD's house, which looketh eastward: and behold at the door of the gate five and

4 Therefore prophesy against them, prophesy, O son of man.

13 And it came to pass, when I prophesied, that Pelatiah the son of Benaiah died. Then fell I down upon my face, and cried with a loud voice, and said, Ah Lord GoD! wilt thou make a full end of the

14 Again the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,

15 Son of man, thy brethren, even thy brethren, the men of thy kindred, and eall the house of Israel wholly, are they unto whom the B.C. 594.

19 And iI will give them one heart, and JI will put a new spirit within you; and I will take the stony heart out of their flesh, and will give them an heart of flesh:

20 That they may walk in my statutes, and keep mine ordinances, and do them: and kthey shall be my people, and I will be their God.

21 But as for them whose heart walketh after the heart of their detestable things and their abominations, I will recompense their way upon their own heads, saith the Lord God.

7 Have ye not seen a vain vision, h 2 Pet.2.14. and have ye not spoken a lying i See Prov. divination, whereas ye say, The LORD saith it: albeit I have not

spoken?

8 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; Because ye have spoken vanity, and seen lies, therefore, behold, I am against you, saith the Lord

GOD.

9 And mine hand shall be upon the prophets that see vanity, and that divine lies: they shall not be in the assembly of my people, eneither shall they be written in the writing of the house of Israel, neither shall they enter into the land of Israel; and ye shall know that I am the Lord GoD.

21 Your kerchiefs also will I tear, and deliver my people out of your hand, and they shall be no more in your hand to be hunted; and ye shall know that I am the LORD.

22 Because with lies ye have made the heart of the righteous sad. whom I have not made sad: and astrengthened the hands of the wicked, that he should not return from his wicked way, by promising him life:

23 Therefore bye shall see no more vanity, nor divine divinations: for I will deliver my people out of your hand: and ye shall know that I am

the LORD.

CHAPTER 14.

The vision of the elders of Israel.

THEN came certain of the elders c Ezk.8.1; of Israel unto me, and sat before me.

2 And the word of the LORD

came unto me, saying,

3 Son of man, these men have set up their idols in their heart, and put the stumblingblock of their iniquity before their face: dshould I be enquired of at all by them?

4 Therefore speak unto them, and say unto them. Thus saith the Lord God: Every man of the house of Israel that setteth up his idols in his heart, and putteth the stumblingblock of his iniquity before his face, and cometh to the prophet; I the LORD will answer him that cometh according to the multitude of his idols:

5 That I may take the house of Israel in their own heart, because they are all estranged from me

through their idols.

6 Therefore say unto the house of Israel, Thus saith the Lord GoD; Repent, and turn yourselves from your idols; and turn away your faces from all your abominations.

7 For every one of the house of Israel, or of the stranger that so- k Ezk.38.22; journeth in Israel, which separateth himself from me, and setteth up his idols in his heart, and putteth the stumblingblock of his iniquity before his face, and cometh to a prophet to enquire of him concerning me; I the LORD will answer him by myself:

8 And I will set my face against that man, and fwill make him a sign and a proverb, and I will cut him off from the midst of my people; and ye shall know that I am

the LORD.

9 And if the prophet be deceived when he hath spoken a thing, I the LORD have gdeceived that prophet, and I will stretch out my hand upon

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him, and will destroy him from the midst of my people Israel.

10 And they shall bear the punishment of their iniquity: the punishment of the prophet shall be even as the punishment of him that seeketh unto him;

11 That the house of Israel may hgo no more astray from me, neither be polluted any more with all their transgressions; but that they may be my people, and I may be their God, saith the Lord GoD.

Jerusalem on no account to be spared.

12 The word of the LORD came

again to me, saying,

13 Son of man, when the land sinneth against me by trespassing grievously, then will I stretch out mine hand upon it, and will break the staff of the bread thereof, and will send famine upon it, and will cut off man and beast from it:

14 iThough these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job, were in it, they should deliver but their own souls by their righteousness, saith

the Lord God.

15 If I cause noisome beasts to pass through the land, and they spoil it, so that it be desolate, that no man may pass through because of the beasts:

16 Though these three men were in it, as I live, saith the Lord God, they shall deliver neither sons nor daughters; they only shall be delivered, but the land shall be desolate.

17 Or if I bring a sword upon that land, and say, Sword, go through the land; so that I jcut off man and

beast from it:

18 Though these three men were in it, as I live, saith the Lord God, they shall deliver neither sons nor daughters, but they only shall be delivered themselves.

19 Or if I send a *pestilence into that land, and pour out my fury upon it in blood, to cut off from it

man and beast:

20 Though Noah, Daniel, and Job, were in it, as I live, saith the Lord God, they shall deliver neither son nor daughter; they shall but deliver their own souls by their righteousness.

21 For thus saith the Lord GoD; How much more when I send my four sore judgments upon Jerusalem, the sword, and the famine, and the noisome beast, and the

pestilence, to cut off from it man

and beast?

22 Yet, behold, therein shall be left a remnant that shall be brought forth, both sons and daughters: behold, they shall come forth unto you, and ve shall see their way and their doings: and ye shall be comforted concerning the evil that I have brought upon Jerusalem, even concerning all that I have brought upon it.

23 And they shall comfort you, when ye see their ways and their doings: and ye shall know that I have not done awithout cause all that I have done in it, saith the

Lord God.

CHAPTER 15.

The vision of the burning vine. (Cf. Isa. 5, 1-24,)

AND the word of the LORD came a Jer.22.8,9.

2 Son of man, What is the bvine tree more than any tree, or than a branch which is among the trees of the forest?

3 Shall wood be taken thereof to d Hos.2.3. do any work? or will men take a e Ex.19.5: pin of it to hang any vessel thereon?

4 Behold, it is cast into the fire for fuel; the fire devoureth both the ends of it, and the midst of it is burned. Is it meet for any work? gi.e. nations.

5 Behold, when it was whole, it h Psa.2.12, was meet for no work: how much less shall it be meet yet for any work, when the fire hath devoured

it, and it is burned?

6 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; As the vine tree among the trees of the forest, which I have given to the fire for fuel, so will I give the inhabitants of Jerusalem.

7 And I will set my face against them; they shall go out from one fire, and another fire shall devour them; and ye shall know that I am the LORD, when I set my face against them.

8 And I will make the land desolate, because they have committed a trespass, saith the Lord God.

CHAPTER 16.

The harlotry of Jerusalem.

A GAIN the work saying, came unto me, saying, GAIN the word of the LORD

2 Son of man, cause Jerusalem to know her abominations,

3 And say, Thus saith the Lord God unto Jerusalem; Thy birth

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and thy nativity is of the land of Canaan; thy father was an Amorite, and thy mother an Hittite.

4 And as for thy nativity, din the day thou wast born thy navel was not cut, neither wast thou washed in water to supple thee; thou wast not salted at all, nor swaddled at all.

5 None eye pitied thee, to do any of these unto thee, to have compassion upon thee; but thou wast cast out in the open field, to the lothing of thy person, in the day that thou wast born.

6 And when I passed by thee, and saw thee polluted in thine own blood, I said unto thee when thou wast in thy blood, Live; yea, I said unto thee when thou wast in thy

blood. Live.

7 I have caused thee to multiply as the bud of the field, and thou hast increased and waxed great, and thou art come to excellent ornaments: thy breasts are fashioned, and thine hair is grown, whereas thou wast naked and bare.

8 Now when I passed by thee, and looked upon thee, behold, thy time was the time of love; and I spread my skirt over thee, and covered thy nakedness: yea, I sware unto thee, and entered into a covenant with thee, saith the Lord God, and ethou becamest mine.

9 Then washed I thee with water: yea, I throughly washed away thy blood from thee, and I anointed thee with oil.

10 I clothed thee also with broidered work, and shod thee with badgers' skin, and I girded thee about with fine linen, and I covered thee with silk.

11 I decked thee also with ornaments, and I put bracelets upon thy hands, and a chain on thy neck.

12 And I put a jewel on thy forehead, and earrings in thine ears, and a beautiful crown upon thine head.

13 Thus wast thou decked with gold and silver; and thy raiment was of fine linen, and silk, and broidered work; thou didst eat fine flour, and honey, and oil: and thou wast exceeding beautiful, and thou didst prosper into a kingdom.

14 And thy renown went forth among the gheathen for thy beauty: for it was perfect through my comeliness, which I had put upon thee,

saith the Lord God. 15 But thou didst htrust in thine

own beauty, and aplayedst the harlot because of thy renown, and pouredst out thy fornications on every one that passed by; his it was.

16 And of thy garments thou didst take, and deckedst thy high places with divers colours, and playedst the harlot thereupon: the like things shall not come, neither shall it be so.

17 Thou hast also taken thy fair jewels of my gold and of my silver, which I had given thee, and madest to thyself images of men, and didst commit whoredom with them.

18 And tookest thy broidered garments, and coveredst them: and thou hast set mine oil and mine in-

cense before them.

19 My meat also which I gave thee, fine flour, and oil, and honey, wherewith I fed thee, thou hast even set it before them for a sweet savour: and thus it was, saith the Lord GOD.

20 Moreover thou hast taken thy sons and thy daughters, whom thou hast borne unto me, and these hast thou sacrificed unto them to be devoured. Is this of thy whoredoms a small matter.

21 That thou hast slain my children, and delivered them to cause them to pass through the fire for

them?

22 And in all thine abominations and thy whoredoms thou hast not remembered the days of thy byouth, when thou wast naked and bare, and wast polluted in thy blood.

23 And it came to pass after all thy wickedness, (woe, woe unto

thee! saith the Lord GoD;)

24 That thou hast also built unto thee an eminent place, and hast made thee an high place in every street.

25 Thou hast built thy high place at every head of the way, and hast made thy beauty to be abhorred, and hast opened thy feet to every one that passed by, and multiplied thy whoredoms.

26 Thou hast also committed fornication with the Egyptians thy neighbours, great of flesh; and hast increased thy whoredoms, to pro-

voke me to anger.

27 Behold, therefore I have stretched out my hand over thee, and have diminished thine ordinary food, and delivered thee unto the will of them that hate thee, the daughters of the Philistines, which are ashamed of thy lewd way.

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also with the Assyrians, because thou wast unsatiable; yea, thou hast played the harlot with them, and yet couldest not be satisfied.

29 Thou hast moreover multiplied thy fornication in the land of Canaan unto Chaldea; and yet thou wast not satisfied berewith

30 How weak is thine heart, saith the Lord God, seeing thou doest all these things, the work of an imperious whorish woman:

31 In that thou buildest thine eminent place in the head of every way, and makest thine high place in every street; and hast not been as an harlot, in that thou scornest hire:

32 But as a wife that committeth adultery, which taketh strangers

instead of her husband!

33 They give gifts to all whores: but thou givest thy gifts to all thy lovers, and hirest them, that they may come unto thee on every side for thy whoredom.

34 And the contrary is in thee from *other* women in thy whoredoms, whereas none followeth thee to commit whoredoms: and in that thou givest a reward, and no reward is given unto thee, therefore thou art contrary.

35 Wherefore, O harlot, hear the

word of the LORD:

36 Thus saith the Lord God; Because thy filthiness was poured out, and thy nakedness discovered through thy whoredoms with thy lovers, and with all the idols of thy abominations, and by the blood of thy children, which thou didst give unto them;

37 Behold, therefore I will gather all thy lovers, with whom thou hast taken pleasure, and all *them* that thou hast loved, with all *them* that thou hast hated; I will even gather them round about against thee, and will discover thy nakedness unto them, that they may see all thy nakedness.

38 And I will judge thee, eas women that break wedlock and shed blood are judged; and I will give thee blood in fury and jeal-

ousy.

39 And I will also give thee into their hand, and they shall throw down thine eminent place, and shall break down thy high places: they shall strip thee also of thy clothes, and shall take thy fair jewels, and leave thee naked and bare.

40 They shall also bring up a company against thee, and they shall stone thee with stones, and thrust thee through with their swords.

41 And athey shall burn thine houses with fire, and execute judgments upon thee in the sight of many women: and I will cause thee to cease from playing the harlot, and thou also shalt give no hire any more.

42 So will I make my fury toward thee to rest, and my jealousy shall depart from thee, and I will be quiet, and will be no more angry.

43 Because thou hast not remembered the days of thy youth, but hast fretted me in all these things; behold, therefore bI also will recompense thy way upon thine head, saith the Lord GoD: and thou shalt a Deut.13.16; not commit this lewdness above all thine abominations.

44 Behold, every one that useth proverbs shall use this proverb b Ezk.9.10; against thee, saying, As is the mother, so is her daughter.

45 Thou art thy mother's daughter, that lotheth her husband and her children; and thou art the sister of thy sisters, which lothed their husbands and their children: your mother was an Hittite, and your father an Amorite.

46 And thine elder sister is Samaria, she and her daughters that dwell at thy left hand: and thy younger sister, that dwelleth at thy h Jer. 32.40; right hand, is Sodom and her daughters.

47 Yet hast thou not walked after their ways, nor done after their abominations: but, as if that were a very little thing, thou wast corrupted more than they in all thy ways.

48 As I live, saith the Lord God. Sodom thy sister hath not done, she nor her daughters, as thou hast done, thou and thy daughters.

49 Behold, this was the iniquity of thy sister Sodom, pride, fulness of bread, and abundance of idleness was in her and in her daughters, neither did she strengthen the hand of the poor and needy.

50 And they were haughty, and dcommitted abomination before me: therefore I took them away as I saw good.

51 Neither hath Samaria committed half of thy sins; but thou hast multiplied thine abominations more than they, and hast justified thy B.C. 594.

sisters in all thine abominations which thou hast done.

52 Thou also, which hast judged thy sisters, bear thine own shame for thy sins that thou hast committed more abominable than they: they are more righteous than thou: yea, be thou confounded also, and bear thy shame, in that thou hast justified thy sisters.

53 eWhen I shall bring again their captivity, the captivity of Sodom and her daughters, and the captivity of Samaria and her daughters, then will I bring again the captivity of thy captives in the

midst of them:

54 That thou mayest bear thine own shame, and mayest be confounded in all that thou hast done, in that thou art a comfort unto them.

55 When thy sisters. Sodom and her daughters, shall return to their former estate, and Samaria and her daughters shall return to their former estate, then thou and thy daughters shall return to your for-

mer estate.
56 For thy sister Sodom was not mentioned by thy mouth in the day

of thy pride,

57 Before thy wickedness was discovered, as at the time of thy freproach of the daughters of Syria. and all that are round about her, the daughters of the Philistines. which despise thee round about.

58 Thou hast borne thy lewdness and thine abominations, saith the

59 For thus saith the Lord GoD: I will even deal with thee as thou hast done, which hast despised the oath in breaking the covenant.

60 Nevertheless gI will remember my covenant with thee in the days of thy youth, and I will establish unto thee han everlasting covenant.

62 And iI will establish my covenant with thee; and thou shalt know that I am the LORD:

63 That thou mayest remember, and be confounded, and never open

branches, and shot forth sprigs. 7 There was also another great h Ezk.4.2; eagle with great wings and many feathers: and, behold, this vine did bend her roots toward him, and shot forth her branches toward him, that he might water it by the fur- j Isa.11.1; rows of her plantation.

8 It was planted in a good soil by bear fruit, that it might be a goodly

vine.

9 Say thou, Thus saith the Lord GoD; Shall it prosper? bshall he not pull up the roots thereof, and cut off the fruit thereof, that it wither? it shall wither in all the leaves of her spring, even without great power or many people to pluck it up by the roots thereof.

10 Yea, behold, being planted, shall it prosper? 'shall it not utterly wither, when the east wind toucheth it? it shall wither in the fur-

rows where it grew.

13 And hath taken of the king's seed, and made a covenant with him, and hath taken an oath of him: he hath also taken the mighty

of the land:

14 That the kingdom might be base, that it might not lift itself up, but that by keeping of his cove-

nant it might stand.

15 But he rebelled against him in sending his ambassadors into Egypt, that they might give him horses and much people. Shall he prosper? shall he escape that doeth such things? or shall he break the covenant, and be delivered?

16 As I live, saith the Lord God,

surely in the place where the king dwelleth that made him king, whose oath he despised, and whose covenant he brake, even with him in the midst of Babylon he shall die.

17 gNeither shall Pharaoh with his mighty army and great company make for him in the war, hby casting up mounts, and building forts, to cut off many persons:

18 Seeing he despised the oath by breaking the covenant, when, lo, he had igiven his hand, and hath done all these things, he shall not

19 Therefore thus saith the Lord God: As I live, surely mine oath that he hath despised, and my covenant that he hath broken, even it will I recompense upon his own head.

20 And I will spread my net upon him, and he shall be taken in my snare, and I will bring him to Babylon, and will plead with him there for his trespass that he hath tres-

passed against me. 21 And all his fugitives with all

his bands shall fall by the sword. and they that remain shall be scattered toward all winds: and ye shall know that I the LORD have spoken it.

22 Thus saith the Lord GoD; I will also take of the highest branch of the high cedar, and will set it; I will crop off from the top of his young twigs ka tender one, and will plant it upon an high mountain and eminent:

23 In the mountain of the height of Israel will I plant it: and it shall bring forth boughs, and bear fruit. and be a goodly cedar: and aunder it shall dwell all fowl of every wing; in the shadow of the branches thereof shall they dwell.

24 And all the trees of the field shall know that I the LORD have brought down the high tree, have exalted the low tree, have dried up the green tree, and have made the a Ezk.31.6; dry tree to flourish: I the LORD have spoken and have done it.

CHAPTER 18.

Ethical instructions for Israel in captivity.

THE word of the LORD came d Ex.22.26; Deut.24. unto me again, saying,

5 But if a man be 'just, and do that which is lawful and right,

6 And hath not eaten upon the mountains, neither hath lifted up his eyes to the idols of the house of Israel, neither hath defiled his neighbour's wife, neither hath come near to a menstruous woman,

7 And hath not oppressed any, but hath restored to the debtor his dpledge, hath spoiled none by violence, hath given his bread to the hungry, and hath covered the naked with a garment;

8 He that hath not given forth m Rom. 2.9. upon eusury, neither hath taken any increase, that hath withdrawn his hand from iniquity, hath executed true judgment between man 0 v.32; Ezk and man,

9 Hath walked in my statutes, and hath kept my judgments, to deal truly; he is just, he shall surely flive, saith the Lord God.

10 If he beget a son that is a robber, a gshedder of blood, and that doeth the like to any one of these things,

11 And that doeth not any of those duties, but even hath eaten upon the mountains, and defiled his neighbour's wife,

12 Hath oppressed the poor and

13 Hath given forth upon usury, and hath taken increase: shall he then live? he shall not live: he hath done all these abominations; he shall surely die; hhis blood shall be upon him.

14 Now, lo, if he beget a son, that seeth all his father's sins which he hath done, and considereth, and

doeth not such like.

15 That hath not eaten upon the mountains, neither hath lifted up his eyes to the idols of the house of Israel, hath not defiled his neighbour's wife,

16 Neither hath oppressed any, hath not withholden the pledge, neither hath spoiled by violence, but hath given his bread to the hungry, and hath covered the na-

ked with a garment,

17 That hath taken off his hand from the poor, that hath not received usury nor increase, hath executed my judgments, hath walked in my statutes; he shall not die for the iniquity of his father, he shall surely live.

18 As for his father, because he cruelly oppressed, spoiled his brother by violence, and did that which is not good among his people, lo, even he shall die in his

iniquity.

19 Yet say ye, Why? idoth not the son bear the iniquity of the father? When the son hath done that which is lawful and right, and hath kept all my statutes, and hath done them, he shall surely live.

20 The soul that sinneth, it shall kThe son shall not bear the die. iniquity of the father, neither shall the father bear the iniquity of the son: the 'righteousness of the righteous shall be upon him, and the mwickedness of the wicked shall be upon him.

21 But nif the wicked will turn from all his sins that he hath committed, and keep all my statutes, and do that which is lawful and right, he shall surely live, he shall not die.

22 All his transgressions that he hath committed, they shall not be mentioned unto him: in his righteousness that he hath done he shall live.

23 °Have I any pleasure at all that the wicked should die? saith

the Lord GoD: and not that he should return from his ways, and live?

24 But when the righteous turneth away from his righteousness. and committeth iniquity, and doeth according to all the abominations that the wicked man doeth. shall he live? All his righteousness that he hath done shall not be mentioned: in his trespass that he hath trespassed, and in his sin that he hath sinned, in them shall he die.

25 Yet ye say, aThe way of the Lord is not equal. Hear now, O a v.29; Ezk. house of Israel; Is not my way equal? are not your ways unequal? b Mt.3.2;

26 When a righteous man turneth away from his righteousness, c Eph.4.22,23. and committeth iniquity, and dieth in them; for his iniquity that he d Ezk.11.19; hath done shall he die.

27 Again, when the wicked man turneth away from his wickedness that he hath committed, and doeth that which is lawful and right, he shall save his soul alive.

28 Because he considereth, and turneth away from all his transgressions that he hath committed, he shall surely live, he shall not die.

29 Yet saith the house of Israel, The way of the Lord is not equal. O house of Israel, are not my ways equal? are not your ways unequal?

30 Therefore I will judge you, O h 2 Ki.23.33; house of Israel, every one according to his ways, saith the Lord bRepent, and turn yourselves from all your transgressions; so iniquity shall not be your ruin.

10 Thy mother is like a vine in thy blood, planted by the waters: she was fruitful and full of branches by reason of many waters.

11 And she had strong rods for the sceptres of them that bare rule. and her stature was exalted among the thick branches, and she appeared in her height with the multitude of her branches.

12 But she was plucked up in fury, she was cast down to the ground, and the east wind dried up her fruit: her strong rods were broken and withered; the fire consumed them.

3 Then say thou, Thus saith the Lord God. The city sheddeth blood in the midst of it, that her time may come, and maketh idols against herself to defile herself.

4 Thou art become guilty in thy blood that thou hast gshed; and hast defiled thyself in thine idols which thou hast made; and thou hast caused thy days to draw near. and art come even unto thy years: htherefore have I made thee a reproach unto the iheathen, and a mocking to all countries.

5 Those that be near, and those that be far from thee, shall mock thee, which art infamous and much vexed.

6 Behold, jthe princes of Israel, every one were in thee to their power to shed blood.

7 In thee have they ket light by father and mother: in the midst of thee have they dealt by oppression with the stranger: in thee have they vexed the fatherless and the widow.

8 Thou hast despised mine holy things, and hast profaned my sab-

baths.

9 In thee are men that carry tales to shed blood: and in thee they eat upon the mountains: in the midst of thee they commit lewdness.

10 In thee have they discovered their fathers' nakedness: in thee have they humbled her that was

set apart for pollution.

11 And one hath committed abomination with his neighbour's wife; and another hath lewdly defiled his daughter in law; and another in thee hath humbled his sister, his father's daughter.

12 In thee mhave they taken gifts to shed blood; thou hast taken usury and increase, and thou hast greedily gained of thy neighbours by extortion, and whast forgotten me, saith the Lord God. 13 Behold, therefore I have smit-

ten mine hand at thy dishonest gain which thou hast made, and at thy blood which hath been in the

midst of thee.

14 Can thine heart endure, or can thine hands be strong, in the days that I shall deal with thee? I the LORD have spoken it, and will do

20 As they gather silver, and brass, and iron, and lead, and tin, c Ezk.22. into the midst of the furnace, to blow the fire upon it, to melt it; so dy.31; Ezk. will I gather you in mine anger and in my fury, and I will leave you there, and melt you.

21 Yea, I will gather you, and blow upon you in the fire of my wrath, and ye shall be melted in

Sins of the priests, princes, prophets, and people.

23 And the word of the LORD j Parables

came unto me, saving,

24 Son of man, say unto her, Thou art the land that is not cleansed, nor rained upon in the day of indignation.

25 There is a conspiracy of her k Ezk.16.8,20. prophets in the midst thereof, like a roaring lion ravening the prey; they have devoured souls; ethey have taken the treasure and precious things; they have made her many widows in the midst thereof.

CHAPTER 23.

The parable of Aholah and Aholibah.

THE word of the LORD came again unto me, saying,

2 Son of man, there were two women, the daughters of one mother: 3 And they committed whoredoms in Egypt; they committed whoredoms in their youth: there were their breasts pressed, and there they bruised the teats of their virginity.

4 And the names of them were Aholah the elder, and Aholibah her sister: and kthey were mine, and they bare sons and daughters. Thus were their names; Samaria is Aholah, and Jerusalem Aholibah.

5 And Aholah played the harlot when she was mine; and she doted on her lovers, on the Assyrians her

neighbours,

6 Which were clothed with blue, captains and rulers, all of them desirable young men, horsemen riding

upon horses.

7 Thus she committed her whoredoms with them, with all them that were the chosen men of Assyria and with all on whom she doted with all their idols she defiled herself.

8 Neither left she her whoredoms brought from Egypt: for in her youth they lay with her, and they bruised the breasts of her virginity and poured their whoredom upor her.

9 Wherefore I have delivered her into the hand of her lovers, into the hand of the ^aAssyrians, upon whom she doted.

10 These discovered her nakedness: they took her sons and her daughters, and slew her with the sword: and she became famous among women; for they had executed judgment upon her.

11 And when her sister Aholibah saw this, she was more corrupt in her inordinate love than she, and in her whoredoms more than her

sister in her whoredoms.

12 She doted upon the Assyrians her neighbours, captains and rulers clothed most gorgeously, horsemen riding upon horses, all of them de-

sirable young men.
13 Then I saw that she was defiled, that they took both one way,

14 And that she increased her whoredoms: for when she saw men a 2 Ki.17.3-6, pourtrayed upon the wall, the images of the Chaldeans pourtrayed b 2 Ki.24.1. with vermilion.

15 Girded with girdles upon their c Jer. 6.8. loins, exceeding in dyed attire upon dy.28; Ezk. look to, after the manner of the Babylonians of Chaldea, the land Jer. 50.21.

of their nativity:

16 bAnd as soon as she saw them with her eyes, she doted upon them. g Ezk,16.37. and sent messengers unto them into h v.17. Chaldea.

17 And the Babylonians came to i.e. nations. her into the bed of love, and they j Jer. 25.15. defiled her with their whoredom, and she was polluted with them, and her mind was alienated from

18 So she discovered her whoredoms, and discovered her nakedness: then 'my mind was alienated from her, like as my mind was alienated from her sister.

19 Yet she multiplied her whoredoms, in calling to remembrance the days of her youth, wherein she had played the harlot in the land of Egypt.

20 For she doted upon their paramours, whose flesh is as the flesh of asses, and whose issue is like the

issue of horses.

21 Thus thou calledst to remembrance the lewdness of thy youth, in bruising thy teats by the Egyptians for the paps of thy youth.

22 Therefore, O Aholibah, thus saith the Lord God; ^dBehold, I will raise up thy lovers against thee, from whom thy mind is alienated, B.C. 593.

23 The Babylonians, and all the Chaldeans, Pekod, and Shoa, and Koa, and all the Assyrians with them: all of them desirable young men, captains and rulers, great lords and renowned, all of them riding upon horses.

24 And they shall come against thee with chariots, wagons, and wheels, and with an assembly of people, which shall set against thee buckler and shield and helmet round about: and I will set judgment before them, and they shall judge thee according to their judgments.

25 And I will set my jealousy against thee, and they shall deal furiously with thee: they shall take away thy nose and thine ears; and thy remnant shall fall by the sword: they shall take thy sons and thy daughters; and thy residue shall be devoured by the fire.

26 They shall also fstrip thee out of thy clothes, and take away thy

fair jewels.

27 Thus will I make thy lewdness to cease from thee, and thy whoredom brought from the land of Egypt: so that thou shalt not lift up thine eyes unto them, nor remember Egypt any more.

28 For thus saith the Lord GoD; Behold, I will deliver thee into the hand of them swhom thou hatest, into the hand of them harom whom

thy mind is alienated:

29 And they shall deal with thee hatefully, and shall take away all thy labour, and shall leave thee naked and bare: and the nakedness of thy whoredoms shall be discovered, both thy lewdness and thy whoredoms.

30 I will do these things unto thee, because thou hast gone a whoring after the theathen, and because thou art polluted with

their idols.

31 Thou hast walked in the way of thy sister; therefore will I give

her jcup into thine hand.

32 Thus saith the Lord GoD; Thou shalt drink of thy sister's cup deep and large: thou shalt be laughed to scorn and had in derision; it containeth much.

33 Thou shalt be filled with drunkenness and sorrow, with the cup of astonishment and desolation, with the cup of thy sister Samaria.

34 Thou shalt even adrink it and suck it out, and thou shalt break the sherds thereof, and pluck off thine own breasts: for I have spoken it, saith the Lord God.

35 Therefore thus saith the Lord God: Because thou bhast forgotten me, and cast me behind thy back, therefore bear thou also thy lewdness and thy whoredoms.

The LORD said moreover unto me; Son of man, wilt thou judge Aholah and Aholibah? yea, declare a Psa.75.8; unto them their abominations;

37 That they have committed adultery, and blood is in their b Ezk. 22.12; hands, and with their idols have they committed adultery, and have also caused their sons, whom they bare unto me, to pass for them through the fire, to devour them. 38 Moreover this they have done d 2 Ki.21.4.

unto me: they have defiled my e 2 Ki.9.30; sanctuary in the same day, and have profaned my sabbaths.

39 For when they had slain their hildren to the hil children to their idols, then they came the same day into my sanctuary to profane it; and, lo, dthus g Ezk.24.21; have they done in the midst of mine house.

40 And furthermore, that ye have h Deut.13.11; sent for men to come from far, unto whom a messenger was sent; and, i.e. January. lo. they came: for whom thou didst wash thyself, epaintedst thy eyes, j Parables and deckedst thyself with ornaments,

41 And satest upon a stately bed, and a table prepared before it, fwhereupon thou hast set mine in-

cense and mine oil.

42 And a voice of a multitude being at ease was with her; and with 1 See 2 Sam. the men of the common sort were brought Sabeans from the wilderness, which put bracelets upon their hands, and beautiful crowns upon m Lev.17.13; their heads.

43 Then said I unto her that was old in adulteries, Will they n v.6; now commit whoredoms with her,

and she with them?

44 Yet they went in unto her, as they go in unto a woman that playeth the harlot: so went they in unto Aholah and unto Aholibah, the lewd women.

45 And the righteous men, they shall judge them after the manner of adulteresses, and after the manner of women that shed blood; because they are adulteresses, and blood is in their hands.

46 For thus saith the Lord GoD;

CHAPTER 24.

The parable of the boiling pot.

AGAIN in the ninth year, in the itenth month, in the tenth day of the month, the word of the LORD came unto me, saving,

2 Son of man, write thee the name of the day, even of this same day: the king of Babylon set himself against Jerusalem this same day.

3 And utter a parable unto the

rebellious house, and say unto them, Thus saith the Lord GoD; Set on a pot, set it on, and also pour water into it:

4 Gather the pieces thereof into it, even every good piece, the thigh, and the shoulder; fill it with the

choice bones.

5 Take the choice of the flock, and burn also the bones under it, and make it boil well, and let them seethe the bones of it therein.

6 Wherefore thus saith the Lord God: kWoe to the bloody city, to the pot whose scum is therein, and whose scum is not gone out of it! bring it out piece by piece; let no lot fall upon it.

7 For her blood is in the midst of her; she set it upon the top of a rock: mshe poured it not upon the ground, to cover it with dust;

8 That it might cause fury to come up to take vengeance; I have set her blood upon the top of a rock, that it should not be covered.

9 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; "Woe to the bloody city! I will even make the pile for fire great.

10 Heap on wood, kindle the fire, consume the flesh, and spice it well, and let the bones be burned. 11 Then set it empty upon the

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coals thereof, that the brass of it may be hot, and may burn, and that the filthiness of it may be molten in it, that the scum of it may be consumed.

12 She hath wearied herself with lies, and her great scum went not forth out of her: her scum shall

be in the fire.

13 In thy filthiness is lewdness: because I have purged thee, and thou wast not purged, thou shalt not be purged from thy filthiness any more, atill I have caused my

fury to rest upon thee.

14 bI the LORD have spoken it: it shall come to pass, and I will do it: I will not go back, neither will I spare, neither will I repent; ac- a Ezk.5.13; cording to thy ways, and according to thy doings, shall they judge thee, b 1 Sam.15.29. saith the Lord God.

Ezekiel again made a sign to Israel. (Cf. Ezk. 12. 11.)

15 Also the word of the LORD

came unto me, saying,

16 Son of man, behold, I take away from thee the desire of thine f Ezk.33.10; eyes with a stroke: yet neither shalt thou mourn nor weep, neither shall thy tears run down.

17 Forbear to cry, make no mourning for the dead, bind the h v.24. tire of thine head upon thee, and dput on thy shoes upon thy feet, i Ezk.21.28; and cover not thy lips, and eat not the bread of men.

18 So I spake unto the people in the morning: and at even my wife died: and I did in the morning as I

was commanded.

19 And the people said unto me, eWilt thou not tell us what these things are to us, that thou doest so? lie. nations.

20 Then I answered them, The word of the LORD came unto me.

saving.

21 Speak unto the house of Israel, Thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I will profane my sanctuary, the excellency of your strength, the desire of your eyes, and that which your soul pitieth; and your sons and your daughters whom ye have left shall fall by the sword.

22 And ye shall do as I have done: ye shall not cover your lips, nor eat

the bread of men.

23 And your tires shall be upon your heads, and your shoes upon your feet: ye shall not mourn nor weep; fbut ye shall pine away for your iniquities, and mourn one toward another.

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24 Thus & Ezekiel is unto you a sign: according to all that he hath done shall ye do: and when this cometh, ye shall know that I am the Lord God.

25 Also, thou son of man, shall it not be in the day when I take from them their strength, the joy of their glory, the desire of their eyes, and that whereupon they set their minds, their sons and their daugh-

26 That he that escapeth in that day shall come unto thee, to cause thee to hear it with thine ears?

27 In that day shall thy mouth be opened to him which is escaped, and thou shalt speak, and be no more dumb: and hthou shalt be a sign unto them; and they shall know that I am the LORD.

The prophecy against the Ammonites.

THE word of the LORD came again unto me, saying,

3 And say unto the Ammonites, Hear the word of the Lord GoD; Thus saith the Lord God; Because thou saidst, Aha, against my sanctuary, when it was profaned; and against the land of Israel, when it was desolate; and against the house of Judah, when they went into captivity;

4 Behold, therefore I will deliver thee to the men of the east for a possession, and they shall set their palaces in thee, and make their dwellings in thee: they shall eat thy fruit, and they shall drink thy

5 And I will make Rabbah a stable for camels, and the Ammonites a couchingplace for flocks: and ye shall know that I am the LORD.

6 For thus saith the Lord GoD; kBecause thou hast clapped thine hands, and stamped with the feet, and rejoiced in heart with all thy despite against the land of Is-

rael:

7 Behold, therefore I will stretch out mine hand upon thee, and will deliver thee for a spoil to the heathen; and I will cut thee off from the people, and I will cause thee to perish out of the countries: I will destroy thee; and thou shalt know that I am the LORD.

The coming judgment upon Moab.

8 1Thus saith the Lord God: Because that Moab and Seir do say. Behold, the house of Judah is like unto all the "heathen;

9 Therefore, behold, I will open the side of Moab from the cities, from his cities which are on his frontiers, the glory of the country, Beth-jeshimoth, Baal-meon, and Kiriathaim.

10 Unto the men of the east with the Ammonites, and will give them in possession, that the Ammonites may not be remembered among the

nations.

11 And I will execute judgments upon Moab; and they shall know a i.e. nations. that I am the LORD.

The coming judgment upon Edom.

12 Thus saith the Lord God: bBecause that Edom hath dealt against the house of Judah by taking ven- c vs.12-14; geance, and hath greatly offended, and revenged himself upon them;

13 Therefore thus saith the Lord d 2 Chr. 28.18. GOD; I will also stretch out mine e Isa.23. hand upon Edom, and will cut off man and beast from it; and I will make it desolate from Teman: and they of Dedan shall fall by the

sword. 14 And I will lay my vengeance

upon Edom by the hand of my people Israel: and they shall do in Edom according to mine anger and according to my fury; and they shall know my vengeance, saith

the Lord God.

The coming judgment upon Philistia.

15 Thus saith the Lord God: Because the dPhilistines have dealt by revenge, and have taken vengeance with a despiteful heart, to destroy it for the old hatred;

16 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I will stretch out mine hand upon the Philistines, and I will cut off the Cherethims, and destroy the remnant of the sea coast.

17 And I will execute great vengeance upon them with furious

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rebukes; and they shall know that I am the LORD, when I shall lay my vengeance upon them.

CHAPTER 26.

The coming judgment upon Tyre.

A ND it came to pass in the eleventh year, in the first day of the month, that the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,

2 Son of man, because that Tyrus hath said against Jerusalem, Aha, she is broken that was the gates of the people: she is turned unto me: I shall be replenished, now she is

laid waste:

3 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I am against thee, O Tyrus, and will cause many nations to come up against thee, as the sea causeth his waves to come up.

4 And they shall destroy the walls of Tyrus, and break down her towers: I will also scrape her dust from her, and make her like the

top of a rock.

5 It shall be a place for the spreading of nets in the midst of the sea: for I have spoken it, saith the Lord God: and it shall become a spoil to the nations.

6 And her daughters which are in the field shall be slain by the sword; and they shall know that I

am the LORD.

7 For thus saith the Lord GoD; Behold, I will bring upon Tyrus Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon, fa king of kings, from the north, with horses, and with chariots, and with horsemen, and companies, and much people.

8 He shall slay with the sword thy daughters in the field: and he shall make a fort against thee, and cast a mount against thee, and lift

up the buckler against thee.

9 And he shall set engines of war against thy walls, and with his axes he shall break down thy towers.

10 By reason of the abundance of his horses their dust shall cover thee: thy walls shall shake at the noise of the horsemen, and of the wheels, and of the chariots, when

12 And they shall make a spoil of thy riches, and make a prey of thy merchandise: and they shall break down thy walls, and destroy thy pleasant houses: and they shall lay thy stones and thy timber and thy dust in the midst of the water.

13 aAnd I will cause the noise of thy songs to cease; and the sound of thy harps shall be no more heard.

14 And I will make thee like the a Isa.14.11; top of a rock: thou shalt be a place to spread nets upon; thou shalt be built no more: for I the LORD have spoken it, saith the Lord God.

15 Thus saith the Lord God to Tyrus; Shall not the bisles shake at the sound of thy fall, when the dEzk,32.10. wounded cry, when the slaughter is made in the midst of thee?

16 Then all the princes of the sea f Ezk.32.18,24. shall come down from their thrones, and lay away their robes, and put g Psa.37.36. off their broidered garments: they h Ezk.28.2. shall clothe themselves with trembling; they shall sit upon the i Ezk.28.12. ground, and dshall tremble at every j Psa.83.7. moment, and be astonished at thee.

17 And they shall take up a lamentation for thee, and say to thee, How art thou destroyed, that l Gen.10.4; wast inhabited of seafaring men, the renowned city, which wast strong in the sea, she and her in- m Ezk. 38.6; habitants, which cause their terror to be on all that haunt it!

18 Now shall the bisles tremble in the day of thy fall; yea, the isles that are in the sea shall be troubled

at thy departure.

19 For thus saith the Lord GoD: When I shall make thee a desolate city, like the cities that are not inhabited: when I shall bring up the deep upon thee, and great waters

shall cover thee:

20 When I shall bring thee down fwith them that descend into the pit, with the people of old time, and shall set thee in the low parts of the earth, in places desolate of old, with them that go down to the pit, that thou be not inhabited: and I shall set glory in the land of the living:

21 I will make thee a terror, and thou shalt be no more: gthough B.C. 588.

thou be sought for, yet shalt thou never be found again, saith the Lord God.

CHAPTER 27.

The lamentation for Tyre. (Cf. Rev. 18. 1-24.)

THE word of the LORD came again unto me, saying,Now, thou son of man, take up

a lamentation for Tyrus; 3 And say unto Tyrus, ^hO thou that art situate at the entry of the sea, which art a merchant of the people for many isles. Thus saith the Lord God; O Tyrus, thou hast said, 'I am of perfect beauty.

4 Thy borders are in the midst of the seas, thy builders have per-

fected thy beauty.

5 They have made all thy ship boards of fir trees of Senir: they have taken cedars from Lebanon to make masts for thee.

6 Of the oaks of Bashan have they made thine oars; the company of the Ashurites have made thy benches of ivory, brought out of

the bisles of Chittim.

7 Fine linen with broidered work from Egypt was that which thou spreadest forth to be thy sail; blue and purple from the isles of Elishah was that which covered thee.

8 The inhabitants of Zidon and Arvad were thy mariners: thy wise men, O Tyrus, that were in thee,

were thy pilots.

9 The ancients of jGebal and the wise men thereof were in thee thy calkers: all the ships of the sea with their mariners were in thee to occupy thy merchandise.

10 They of Persia and of Lud and of kPhut were in thine army, thy men of war: they hanged the shield and helmet in thee; they set forth

thy comeliness.

11 The men of Arvad with thine army were upon thy walls round about, and the Gammadims were in thy towers: they hanged their shields upon thy walls round about; they have made thy beauty perfect.

12 Tarshish was thy merchant by reason of the multitude of all kind of riches; with silver, iron, tin, and lead, they traded in thy fairs.

13 Javan, Tubal, and Meshech, they were thy merchants: they traded the persons of men and vessels of brass in thy market.

14 They of the house of ^mTogar-

mah traded in thy fairs with horses and horsemen and mules.

15 The men of aDedan were thy merchants; many bisles were the merchandise of thine hand: they brought thee for a present horns of

ivory and ebony.

16 Syria was thy merchant by reason of the multitude of the wares of thy making: they occupied in thy fairs with emeralds, purple, and broidered work, and fine linen, and coral, and agate.

17 Judah, and the land of Israel. they were thy merchants: they traded in thy market 'wheat of Minnith, and Pannag, and honey,

and oil, and balm.

18 Damascus was thy merchant in the multitude of the wares of thy making, for the multitude of all riches; in the wine of Helbon, and white wool.

19 Dan also and Javan going to and fro occupied in thy fairs: bright iron, cassia, and calamus, were in

thy market.

20 Dedan was thy merchant in

precious clothes for chariots.

21 Arabia, and all the princes of Kedar, they occupied with thee in d Gen.11.31; lambs, and rams, and goats: in these were they thy merchants.

22 The merchants of Sheba and Raamah, they were thy merchants: f Rev.18.18. they occupied in thy fairs with chief of all spices, and with all precious g v.9. stones, and gold.

23 dHaran, and Canneh, and Eden, the merchants of Sheba. Asshur. and Chilmad, were thy merchants,

24 These were thy merchants in all sorts of things, in blue clothes, and broidered work, and in chests of rich apparel, bound with cords, and made of cedar, among thy merchandise.

25 The ships of Tarshish did sing of thee in thy market: and thou wast replenished, and made very glorious in the midst of the seas.

26 Thy rowers have brought thee into great waters: the east wind hath broken thee in the midst of the seas.

27 Thy riches, and thy fairs, thy merchandise, thy mariners, and thy pilots, thy calkers, and the occupiers of thy merchandise, and all thy men of war, that are in thee, and in all thy company which is in the midst of thee, shall fall into the midst of the seas in the day of thy ruin.

28 The suburbs shall shake at the sound of the cry of thy pilots.

30 And shall cause their voice to be heard against thee, and shall cry bitterly, and shall cast up dust upon their heads, they shall wallow them-

selves in the ashes:

31 And they shall make themselves utterly bald for thee, and gird them with sackcloth, and they shall weep for thee with bitterness of heart and bitter wailing.

32 And in their wailing they shall take up a lamentation for thee, and lament over thee, saying, What city is like Tyrus, like the destroyed in the midst of the sea?

33 When thy wares went forth out of the seas, thou filledst many people: thou didst enrich the kings of the earth with the multitude of thy riches and of thy merchandise.

34 In the time when thou shalt be broken by the seas in the depths of the waters thy merchandise and all thy company in the midst of thee shall fall.

35 All the inhabitants of the bisles shall be astonished at thee, and their kings shall be sore afraid, they shall be troubled in their

countenance. 36 The merchants among the people shall hiss at thee; thou shalt be a terror, and never shalt be any

CHAPTER 28.

The rebuke of the king of Tyre.

THE word of the LORD came again unto me, saying,

2 Son of man, say unto the prince of Tyrus, Thus saith the Lord GoD; Because thine heart is lifted up, and thou hast said, I am a hGod, I sit in the seat of God, in the midst of the seas; yet thou art a man, and not God, though thou set thine heart as the heart of God:

3 Behold, thou art wiser than Daniel: there is no secret that they

can hide from thee:

4 With thy wisdom and with thine understanding thou hast gotten thee riches, and hast gotten gold and silver into thy treasures:

5 By thy great wisdom and by thy traffick hast thou increased thy riches, and thine heart is lifted up because of thy riches:

6 Therefore thus saith the Lord GoD; aBecause thou hast set thine

heart as the heart of God:

7 Behold, therefore I will bring strangers upon thee, the terrible of the nations: and they shall draw their swords against the beauty of thy wisdom, and they shall defile

thy brightness.

8 They shall bring thee down to the pit, and thou shalt die the deaths of them that are slain in

the midst of the seas.

9 Wilt thou yet say before him a The Beast. that slayeth thee, I am God? but thou shalt be a man, and no God, in the hand of him that slaveth thee.

10 Thou shalt die the deaths of bEzk.27.3; the uncircumcised by the hand of strangers: for I have spoken it, saith the Lord GoD.

11 Moreover the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,

13 Thou hast been in Eden the garden of God; every precious stone g Ezk.38.22. was thy covering, the sardius, h Num.33.55; topaz, and the diamond, the beryl, the onyx, and the jasper, the sap-phire, the emerald, and the carbuncle, and gold: the workmanship of thy tabrets and of thy pipes was prepared in thee in the day that jie. nations. thou wast created.

14 Thou art the anointed dcherub k Ezk.36.28; that covereth; and I have set thee so: thou wast upon the holy mountain of God; thou hast walked up and down in the midst of the stones

15 Thou wast perfect in thy ways from the day that thou wast created, till iniquity was found in

16 By the multitude of thy merchandise they have filled the midst of thee with violence, and thou hast sinned: therefore I will cast thee as profane out of the mountain of God: and I will destroy thee, O covering B.C. 588.

24 And there shall be no more ha pricking brier unto the house of Israel, nor any grieving thorn of all that are round about them, that despised them; and they shall know that I am the Lord God.

The future regathering of Israel.

25 Thus saith the Lord GoD: When I shall have igathered the house of Israel from the people among whom they are scattered, and shall be sanctified in them in the sight of the heathen, then shall they dwell in their land that I have given to my servant Jacob. 26 And they shall ^kdwell safely

Here (vs. 12-15), as in Isa. 14. 12, the language goes beyond the king of Tyre to Satan, inspirer and unseen ruler of all such pomp and pride as that of Tyre. Instances of thus indirectly addressing Satan are: Gen. 3. 14, 15; Mt. 16. 23. The unfallen state of Satan is here described; his fall in Isa. 14. 12-14. (See Rev. 20. 10, note.) But there is more. The vision is not of Satan in his own person, but of Satan fulfilling himself in and through an earthly king who arrogates to himself divine honours, so that the prince of Tyrus foreshadows the Beast (Dan. 7. 8; Rev. 19. 20).

6 And all the inhabitants of Jer. 27.6. Egypt shall know that I am the LORD, because they have been fa staff of reed to the house of Israel.

7 When they took hold of thee by thy hand, thou didst break, and rend all their shoulder: and when they leaned upon thee, thou brakest, and madest all their loins to be at a stand.

8 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I will bring a sword upon thee, and cut off man and beast out of thee.

9 And the land of Egypt shall be desolate and waste; and they shall know that I am the LORD: because he hath said. The river is mine,

and I have made it.

10 Behold, therefore I am against thee, and against thy rivers, and I will make the land of Egypt utterly waste and desolate, gfrom the tower of Syene even unto the border of Ethiopia.

11 No foot of man shall pass through it, nor foot of beast shall pass through it, neither shall it be inhabited forty years.
12 And I will make the land of

Egypt desolate in the midst of the countries that are desolate, and her cities among the cities that are laid waste shall be desolate forty years: and I will scatter the Egyptians among the nations, and will disperse them through the countries.

13 Yet thus saith the Lord GoD; At the end of forty years will I gather the Egyptians from the peo-

6 All the fowls of heaven made fi.e. nations. their nests in his boughs, and under g Ezk.32.4; his branches did all the beasts of the field bring forth their young, and under his shadow dwelt all h Ezk.32.18. great nations.

7 Thus was he fair in his greatness, in the length of his branches: for his root was by great waters.

8 The cedars in the egarden of God could not hide him: the fir k Ezk.32.31. trees were not like his boughs, and l Ezk.28.10; the chesnut trees were not like his branches; nor any tree in the gar-mi.e. March; den of God was like unto him in his beauty.

9 I have made him fair by the multitude of his branches: so that all the trees of Eden, that were in the garden of God, envied him.

3 Thus saith the Lord God; I will therefore spread out my net over thee with a company of many people; and they shall bring thee up in

my net.

4 Then awill I leave thee upon the land, I will cast thee forth upon the open field, and will cause all the fowls of the heaven to remain upon thee, and I will fill the beasts of the whole earth with thee.

23 hWhose graves are set in the sides of the pit, and her company is round about her grave: all of them slain, fallen by the sword, which caused terror in the land of the living.

There is iElam and all her multitude round about her grave, all of them slain, fallen by the sword, which are gone down uncircumcised into the nether parts of the earth, which caused their terror in the land of the living; yet have they borne their shame with them

7 So thou, O son of man, I have set thee a watchman unto the house of Israel; therefore thou shalt hear the word at my mouth, and warn

12 As a shepherd seeketh out his flock in the day that he is among his sheep that are scattered: so will I seek out my sheep, and will deliver m Gen.12.2; Isa.19.24: them out of all places where they have been scattered in the cloudy and dark day.

13 And gI will bring them out from the people, and gather them from the countries, and will bring them to their own land, and feed them upon the mountains of Israel by the rivers, and in all the inhabited places of the country.

14 I will feed them in a good pasture, and upon the high mountains of Israel shall their fold be: there shall they lie in a good fold, and in B.C. 587.

a fat pasture shall they feed upon the mountains of Israel.

15 I will feed my flock, and I will cause them to lie down, saith the

Lord God.

16 I hwill seek that which was lost, and bring again that which was driven away, and will bind up that which was broken, and will strengthen that which was sick: but I will destroy the fat and the strong; I will feed them with judgment.

17 And as for you, O my flock, thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I judge between cattle and cattle, between the rams and the he goats.

18 Seemeth it a small thing unto you to have eaten up the good pasture, but ye must tread down with your feet the residue of your pastures? and to have drunk of the deep waters, but ye must foul the residue with your feet?

19 And as for my flock, they eat that which ye have trodden with your feet; and they drink that which ye have fouled with your

feet.

20 Therefore thus saith the Lord God unto them; Behold, I, even I, will judge between the fat cattle and between the lean cattle.

21 Because ye have thrust with side and with shoulder, and pushed all the diseased with your horns, till ye have scattered them abroad;

22 Therefore will I save my flock, and they shall no more be a prey; and I will judge between cattle and cattle.

23 And I will set up ione shepherd over them, and he shall feed them, even my servant David; he shall feed them, and he shall be their shepherd.

24 JAnd I the LORD will be their God, and my servant David a prince among them; I the LORD

have spoken it.

25 kAnd I will make with them a covenant of peace, and will cause the evil beasts to cease out of the land: and they shall dwell safely in the wilderness, and sleep in the woods.

26 And I will make them and the places round about my hill ma blessing; and I will cause the shower to come down in his season; there shall be showers of blessing.

5 Because thou hast had a perpetual hatred, and hast shed the blood of the children of Israel by the force of the sword in the time of their calamity, in the time that their iniquity had an end:

6 Therefore, as I live, saith the Lord God, I will prepare thee unto blood, and blood shall pursue thee: sith thou hast not hated blood, even

blood shall pursue thee.

7 Thus will I make mount Seir most desolate, and cut off from it him that passeth out and him that returneth.

8 And I will fill his mountains

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with his slain men: in thy hills, and in thy valleys, and in all thy rivers, shall they fall that are slain with the sword.

9 fI will make thee perpetual desolations, and thy cities shall not return: and ye shall know that I

am the LORD.

10 Because thou hast said. These two nations and these two countries shall be mine, and we will possess it: whereas the LORD was there:

11 Therefore, as I live, saith the Lord God, I will even do according to thine anger, and according to thine envy which thou hast used out of thy hatred against them; and I will make myself known among them, when I have judged thee.

12 And thou shalt know that I am

the LORD, and that I have heard all thy blasphemies which thou hast spoken against the mountains of Israel, saying, They are laid desolate, they are given us to consume.

13 Thus with your mouth ye have boasted against me, and have multiplied your words against me: I have heard *them*.

14 Thus saith the Lord GoD; gWhen the whole earth rejoiceth, I

swallowed you up on every side, that we might be a possession unto the residue of the aheathen, and bye are taken up in the lips of talkers, and are an infamy of the people:

4 Therefore, ye mountains of Israel, hear the word of the Lord GoD; Thus saith the Lord GoD to the mountains, and to the hills, to the rivers, and to the valleys, to the desolate wastes, and to the cities that are forsaken, which became a prey and derision to the residue of the cheathen that are round about;

5 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; Surely in the fire of my jealousy have I spoken against the residue of the aheathen, and against all Idumea, which have appointed my land into their possession with the joy of all their heart, with despiteful minds, to cast it out for a b Deut.28.37;

6 Prophesy therefore concerning the land of Israel, and say unto the mountains, and to the hills, to the cv.15; rivers, and to the valleys, Thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I have spoken in my jealousy and in my d Oba.17. fury, because ye have borne the shame of the aheathen:

7 Therefore thus saith the Lord f Lev. 18.25, God; I have lifted up mine hand, Surely the aheathen that are about you, they shall bear their shame.

8 But ye, O mountains of Israel, ye shall shoot forth your branches, h Israel and yield your fruit to my people of Israel; for they are at hand to come.

9 For, behold, I am for you, and I will turn unto you, and ye shall be

tilled and sown:

10 And I will multiply men upon you, all the house of Israel, even all of it: and the cities shall be inhabited, and the wastes shall be builded:

11 And I will multiply upon you man and beast; and they shall increase and bring fruit: and I will settle you after your old estates, and will do better unto you than at your beginnings: and ye shall know that I am the LORD.

12 Yea, I will cause men to walk upon you, even my people Israel; and dthey shall possess thee, and thou shalt be their inheritance, and thou shalt no more henceforth be-

3 And say, Thus saith the Lord GoD; Behold, I am against thee, O aGog, the chief prince of Meshech

and Tubal:

4 And I will turn thee back, and put hooks into thy jaws, and I will bring thee forth, and all thine army, horses and horsemen, all of them clothed with all sorts of armour, even a great company with bucklers and shields, all of them handling swords:

5 Persia, Ethiopia, and Libya with them; all of them with shield

and helmet:

6 Gomer, and all his bands; the house of Togarmah of the north quarters, and all his bands: and a v.2, note many people with thee.

7 Be thou prepared, and prepare bie. nations. for thyself, thou, and all thy company that are assembled unto thee, and be thou a guard unto them.

8 After many days thou shalt be visited: in the latter years thou shalt come into the land that is brought back from the sword, and is gathered out of many people, against the mountains of Israel, which have been always waste: but it is brought forth out of the nations, and they shall dwell safely all of them.

9 Thou shalt ascend and come like a storm, thou shalt be like a cloud to cover the land, thou, and all thy bands, and many people with

thee.

10 Thus saith the Lord GoD; It shall also come to pass, that at the same time shall things come into thy mind, and thou shalt think an evil thought:

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11 And thou shalt say, I will go up to the land of unwalled villages; I will go to them that are at rest, that dwell safely, all of them dwelling without walls, and having neither bars nor gates,

12 To take a spoil, and to take a prey; to turn thine hand upon the desolate places that are now inhabited, and upon the people that are gathered out of the nations. which have gotten cattle and goods, that dwell in the midst of the land.

13 Sheba, and Dedan, and the merchants of Tarshish, with all the young lions thereof, shall say unto thee. Art thou come to take a spoil? hast thou gathered thy company to take a prey? to carry away silver and gold, to take away cattle and goods, to take a great spoil?

14 Therefore, son of man, prophesy and say unto ^aGog, Thus saith the Lord GoD; In that day when my people of Israel dwelleth safely, shalt thou not know it?

15 And thou shalt come from thy place out of the north parts, thou, and many people with thee, all of them riding upon horses, a great company, and a mighty army:

16 And thou shalt come against my people of Israel, as a cloud to cover the land; it shall be in the latter days, and I will bring thee against my land, that the bheathen may know me, when I shall be sanctified in thee, O aGog, before their

17 Thus saith the Lord GoD: Art thou he of whom I have spoken in old time by my servants the prophets of Israel, which prophesied in those days many years that I would bring thee against them?

18 And it shall come to pass at the same time when aGog shall come against the land of Israel, saith the Lord God, that my fury shall come

up in my face.

19 For in my jealousy and in the fire of my wrath have I spoken,

¹ That the primary reference is to the northern (European) powers, headed up by Russia, all agree. The whole passage should be read in connection with Zech. 12. 1-4; 14. 1-9; Mt. 24. 14-30; Rev. 14. 14-20; 19. 17-21. "Gog" is the prince, "Magog," his land. The reference to Meshech and Tubal (Moscow and Tobolsk) is a clear mark of identification. Russia and the northern powers have been the latest persecutors of dispersed Israel, and it is congruous both with divine justice and with the covenants (e.g. Gen. 15. 18, note; Deut. 30. 3, note) that destruction should fall at the climax of the last mad attempt to exterminate the remnant of Israel in Jerusalem. The whole prophecy belongs to the yet future "day of Jehovah" (Isa. 2. 10-22; Rev. 19. 11-21), and to the battle of Armageddon (Rev. 16. 14; 19. 19, note), but includes also the final revolt of the nations at the close of the kingdom-age (Rev. 20. 7-9).

the day whereof I have spoken. 9 And they that dwell in the cities of Israel shall go forth, and shall set on fire and burn the weapons, both the shields and the bucklers. the bows and the arrows, and the handstaves, and the spears, and they shall burn them with fire seven years:

12 And seven months shall the house of Israel be burying of them, that they may cleanse the land.

13 Yea, all the people of the land shall bury them; and it shall be to them a renown the day that I shall be glorified, saith the Lord God.

14 And they shall sever out men of continual employment, passing through the land to bury with the passengers those that remain upon the face of the earth, to cleanse it: after the end of seven months shall they search.

15 And the passengers that pass through the land, when any seeth a man's bone, then shall he set up a sign by it, till the buriers have buried it in the valley of Hamon-

CHAPTER 40.

Vision of the man with the measuring reed.

IN the five and twentieth year of our captivity, in the beginning of the year, in the tenth day of the month, in the fourteenth year after that the city was smitten, in the selfsame day the hand of the LORD was upon me, and brought me thither.

2 In the visions of God brought he me into the land of Israel, and set me upon a very high mountain, by which was as the frame of a city

on the south.

3 And he brought me thither, and, m One cubit = behold, there was a kman, whose appearance was like the appearance of brass, with a line of flax in his hand, and a measuring ¹reed; and he stood in the gate.

4 And the man said unto me, Son of man, behold with thine eyes, and hear with thine ears, and set thine heart upon all that I shall shew thee: for to the intent that I might shew them unto thee art thou B.C. 574.

brought hither: declare all that thou seest to the house of Israel.

Vision of the future temple.

5 And behold a wall on the outside of the house round about, and in the man's hand a measuring reed of six mcubits long by the cubit and an hand breadth: so he measured the breadth of the building, one reed; and the height, one reed.

6 Then came he unto the gate which looked toward the east, and went up the stairs thereof, and measured the threshold of the gate, which was one reed broad; and the other threshold of the gate, which

was one reed broad.

7 And every little chamber was one reed long, and one reed broad; and between the little chambers were five cubits; and the threshold of the gate by the porch of the gate within was one reed.

8 He measured also the porch of

the gate within, one reed.

9 Then measured he the porch of the gate, eight cubits; and the posts thereof, two cubits; and the porch of the gate was inward.

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10 And the little chambers of the gate eastward were three on this side, and three on that side; they three were of one measure: and the posts had one measure on this side and on that side.

11 And he measured the breadth of the entry of the gate, ten cubits; and the length of the gate, thirteen

cubits.

12 The space also before the little chambers was one cubit on this side, and the space was one cubit on that side: and the little chambers were six cubits on this side, and six cubits on that side.

13 He measured then the gate from the roof of one little chamber to the roof of another: the breadth was five and twenty cubits, door

against door.

14 He made also posts of threescore cubits, even unto the post of the court round about the gate.

15 And from the face of the gate of the entrance unto the face of the porch of the inner gate were fifty a 1 Ki.6.4.

cubits.

16 And there were anarrow windows to the little chambers, and to c 1 Ki.6.5. their posts within the gate round d Ezk. 45.5. about, and likewise to the arches: and windows were round about in- e See vs.21, ward: and upon each post were palm trees.

Then brought he me into the boutward court, and, lo, there were chambers, and a pavement made for the court round about: dthirty chambers were upon the

pavement.

18 And the pavement by the side of the gates over against the length of the gates was the lower pave-

ment.

19 Then he measured the breadth from the forefront of the lower gate unto the forefront of the inner court without, an hundred cubits eastward and northward.

20 And the gate of the outward court that looked toward the north, he measured the length thereof, and

the breadth thereof.

21 And the little chambers thereof were three on this side and three on that side; and the posts thereof and the arches thereof were after the measure of the first gate: the length thereof was fifty cubits, and the breadth five and twenty cubits.

22 And their windows, and their arches, and their palm trees, were after the measure of the gate that looketh toward the east; and they

went up unto it by seven steps; and the arches thereof were before them.

23 And the gate of the inner court was over against the gate toward the north, and toward the east; and he measured from gate to gate an hundred cubits.

24 After that he brought me toward the south, and behold a gate toward the south: and he measured the posts thereof and the arches thereof according to these measures.

25 And there were windows in it and in the arches thereof round about, like those windows: the length was fifty cubits, and the breadth five and twenty cubits.

26 And there were seven steps to go up to it, and the arches thereof were before them: and it had palm trees, one on this side, and another on that side, upon the posts thereof.

27 And there was a gate in the inner court toward the south: and he measured from gate to gate toward the south an hundred cubits.

28 And he brought me to the inner court by the south gate: and he measured the south gate according to these measures:

29 And the little chambers thereof, and the posts thereof, and the arches thereof, according to these measures: and there were windows in it and in the arches thereof round about: it was fifty cubits long, and efive and twenty cubits broad.

30 And the arches round about were five and twenty cubits long,

and five cubits broad.

31 And the arches thereof were toward the utter court; and palm trees were upon the posts thereof: and the going up to it had eight steps.

32 And he brought me into the inner court toward the east: and he measured the gate according to

these measures.

33 And the little chambers thereof, and the posts thereof, and the arches thereof, were according to these measures: and there were windows therein and in the arches thereof round about: it was fifty cubits long, and five and twenty cubits broad.

34 And the arches thereof were toward the outward court; and palm trees were upon the posts thereof, on this side, and on that side: and the going up to it had eight steps.

35 And he brought me to the

north gate, and measured it according to these measures;

36 The little chambers thereof, the posts thereof, and the arches thereof, and the windows to it round about: the length was fifty cubits, and the breadth five and twenty cubits.

37 And the posts thereof were toward the utter court; and palm trees were upon the posts thereof on this side, and on that side: and the going up to it had eight steps.

38 And the chambers and the entries thereof were by the posts of the gates, where they washed the

burnt-offering.

39 And in the porch of the gate were two tables on this side, and two tables on that side, to slay thereon the burnt-offering and the asin- a Lev.4.2,3. offering and the btrespass-offering. b Lev.5.6;

40 And at the side without, cas one goeth up to the entry of the north gate, were two tables; and on the other side, which was at the porch of the gate, were two tables.

41 Four tables were on this side, and four tables on that side, by the side of the gate; eight tables, whereupon they slew their sacrifices.

42 And the four tables were of hewn stone for the burnt-offering, of a cubit and an half long, and a cubit and an half broad, and one cubit high: whereupon also they laid the instruments wherewith they slew the burnt-offering and the sacrifice.

43 And within were dhooks, an hand broad, fastened round about: and upon the tables was the flesh

of the offering.

The chambers of the singers and priests.

· 44 And without the inner gate were the chambers of the singers in the inner court, which was at the side of the north gate; and their prospect was toward the south: one at the side of the east gate having the prospect toward the north.

45 And he said unto me, This chamber, whose prospect is toward the south, is for the priests, the ekeepers of the charge of the house.

46 And the chamber whose prospect is toward the north is for the priests, the keepers of the charge of the altar: these are the sons of fZadok among the sons of Levi, which come near to the LORD to minister unto him.

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47 So he measured the court, an hundred cubits long, and an hundred cubits broad, foursquare; and

the altar that was before the house.

The porch of the temple.

48 And he brought me to the porch of the house, and measured each post of the porch, five cubits on this side, and five cubits on that side: and the breadth of the gate was three cubits on this side, and three cubits on that side.

49 The length of the porch was twenty cubits, and the breadth eleven cubits; and he brought me by the steps whereby they went up to it: and there were pillars by the posts, one on this side, and another

on that side.

CHAPTER 41.

Description of the temple.

AFTERWARD he brought me to the temple, and measured the posts, six cubits broad on the one side, and six cubits broad on the other side, which was the breadth of the tabernacle.

2 And the breadth of the door was ten cubits: and the sides of the door were five cubits on the one side, and five cubits on the other side: and he measured the length thereof, forty cubits: and the

breadth, twenty cubits.

3 Then went he inward, and measured the post of the door, two cubits; and the door, six cubits; and the breadth of the door, seven

cubits.

4 So ghe measured the length thereof, twenty cubits; and the breadth, twenty cubits, before the temple: and he said unto me, This is the most holy place.

5 After he measured the wall of the house, six hcubits; and the breadth of every side chamber, four cubits, round about the house on

every side.

6 And the side chambers were three, one over another, and thirty in order; and they entered into the wall which was of the house for the side chambers round about, that they might have hold, but they had not hold in the wall of the house.

7 And ithere was an enlarging, and a winding about still upward to the side chambers: for the winding about of the house went still upward round about the house: therefore the breadth of the house was still upward, and so increased from the lowest chamber to the highest by the midst.

8 I saw also the height of the house round about: the foundations of the side chambers were a full

areed of six great cubits.

9 The thickness of the wall, which was for the side chamber without, was five cubits: and that which was left was the place of the side chambers that were within.

10 And between the chambers was the wideness of twenty cubits round about the house on every

side.

11 And the doors of the side chambers were toward the place that was left, one door toward the north, and another door toward the south: and the breadth of the place that was left was five cubits round about.

12 Now the building that was before the separate place at the end a One reed = toward the west was seventy cubits broad; and the wall of the building b 1 Ki.6.29. was five cubits thick round about. and the length thereof ninety cubits. c Ex.30.1.

13 So he measured the house, an d 1 Ki.6.31hundred cubits long; and the separate place, and the building, with the walls thereof, an hundred

cubits long;

14 Also the breadth of the face of f One cubit = the house, and of the separate place toward the east. an hundred

cubits.

15 And he measured the length of the building over against the separate place which was behind it, and the galleries thereof on the one side and on the other side, an hundred cubits, with the inner temple, and the porches of the court;

16 The door posts, and the narrow windows, and the galleries round about on their three stories, over against the door, cieled with wood round about, and from the ground up to the windows, and the windows

were covered;
17 To that above the door, even unto the inner house, and without, and by all the wall round about within and without, by measure.

18 And it was made bwith cherubims and palm trees, so that a palm tree was between a cherub and a cherub; and every cherub had two faces;

19 So that the face of a man was toward the palm tree on the one side, and the face of a young lion toward the palm tree on the other

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side: it was made through all the house round about.

20 From the ground unto above the door were cherubims and palm trees made, and on the wall of the temple.

21 The posts of the temple were squared, and the face of the sanctuary: the appearance of the one as the appearance of the other.

22 The altar of wood was three cubits high, and the length thereof two cubits: and the corners thereof. and the length thereof, and the walls thereof, were of wood: and he said unto me, This is the table that is before the LORD.

23 dAnd the temple and the sanc-

tuary had two doors.

24 And the doors had two leaves apiece, two turning leaves; two leaves for the one door, and two

leaves for the other door.

25 And there were made on them, on the doors of the temple, cherubims and palm trees, like as were made upon the walls; and there were thick planks upon the face of the porch without. 26 And there were narrow win-

dows and palm trees on the one side and on the other side, on the sides of the porch, and upon the side chambers of the house, and

thick planks.

CHAPTER 42.

(Description of the temple, continued.)

HEN he brought me forth into the utter court, the way toward the north: and he brought me into the echamber that was over against the separate place, and which was before the building toward the north.

2 Before the length of an hundred fcubits was the north door, and the

breadth was fifty cubits.

3 Over against the twenty cubits which were for the inner court, and over against the pavement which was for the utter court, was gallery against gallery in three stories. 4 And before the chambers was a

walk of ten cubits breadth inward, a way of one cubit; and their doors

toward the north.

5 Now the upper chambers were shorter: for the galleries were higher than these, than the lower, and than the middlemost of the building.

6 For they were in three stories,

but had not pillars as the pillars of the courts: therefore the building was straitened more than the lowest and the middlemost from the ground.

7 And the wall that was without over against the chambers, toward the utter court on the forepart of the chambers, the length thereof was fifty cubits.

8 For the length of the chambers that were in the utter court was fifty cubits: and, lo, before the temple were an hundred cubits.

9 And from under these chambers was the entry on the east side, as one goeth into them from the utter court

10 The chambers were in the thickness of the wall of the court b Lit. meal. toward the east, over against the separate place, and over against the building.

11 And the way before them was like the appearance of the chambers which were toward the north, as long as they, and as broad as they: and all their goings out were both according to their fashions, and according to their doors.

12 And according to the doors of the chambers that were toward the south was a door in the head of the way, even the way directly before f Ezk.10.4; the wall toward the east, as one

entereth into them.

13 Then said he unto me, The north chambers and the south h Holy Spirit. chambers, which are before the separate place, they be holy chambers, where the priests that approach unto the LORD ashall eat the most holy things: there shall they lay the most holy things, and the bmeat-offering, and the sin-Gen.1.26-28; offering, and the trespass-offering; for the place is holy.

14 When the priests enter therein, then shall they not go out of the holy place into the utter court, but there they shall lay their garments wherein they minister; for they are holy; and shall put on other garments, and shall approach to those things which are for the people.

15 Now when he had made an end of measuring the inner house, he brought me forth toward the gate whose prospect is toward the east. and measured it round about.

16 He measured the east side with the measuring 'reed, five hundred reeds, with the measuring reed

round about.

17 He measured the north side,

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five hundred reeds, with the mea-

suring reed round about. 18 He measured the south side, five hundred reeds, with the measuring reed.

19 He turned about to the west side, and measured five hundred reeds with the measuring reed.

20 He measured it by the four sides: it had a wall round about, five hundred reeds long, and five hundred broad, to make a separation between the sanctuary and the profane place.

CHAPTER 43.

(Description of the temple, continued.)

A FTERWARD he prought me to the gate, even the gate that looketh toward the east: FTERWARD he brought me to

Vision of the glory of the Lord filling the temple.

2 dAnd, behold, the glory of the God of Israel came from the way of the east: and this voice was like a noise of many waters: fand the earth shined with his glory.

3 And it was according to the appearance of the vision which I saw, even according to the vision that I saw when I came to destroy the city: and the visions were like the vision that I saw by the river Chebar; and I fell upon my face.

4 gAnd the glory of the LORD came into the house by the way of the gate whose prospect is toward

the east. 5 So the hspirit took me up, and brought me into the inner court; and, behold, the glory of the LORD

filled the house.
6 And I heard him speaking unto me out of the house; and the man stood by me.

8 In their setting of their threshold by my thresholds, and their post by my posts, and the wall between me and them, they have even

14 And from the bottom upon the ground even to the lower settle shall be two cubits, and the breadth one cubit; and from the lesser settle even to the greater settle shall be four cubits, and the

breadth one cubit.

15 So the altar shall be four cubits: and from the altar and upward shall be four horns.

16 And the altar shall be twelve cubits long, twelve broad, square

in the four squares thereof.

17 And the settle shall be fourteen cubits long and fourteen broad in the four squares thereof; and the border about it shall be half a cubit: and the bottom thereof shall be a cubit about: and his stairs shall look toward the east.

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18 And he said unto me. Son of man, thus saith the Lord GoD: These are the ordinances of the altar in the day when they shall make it, to offer burnt-offerings thereon, and to sprinkle blood thereon.

19 1And thou shalt give to the dpriests the Levites that be of the seed of Zadok, which approach unto me, to minister unto me, saith the Lord God, a eyoung bullock for a sin-offering.

20 And thou shalt take of the blood thereof, and put it on the four horns of it, and on the four corners of the settle, and upon the border round about: thus shalt thou

cleanse and purge it.

21 Thou shalt take the bullock also of the sin-offering, and he fshall burn it in the appointed place of the house, gwithout the sanctuary.

25 Seven days shalt thou prepare every day a goat for a sinoffering: they shall also prepare a young bullock, and a ram out of the flock, without blemish.

26 Seven days shall they purge the altar and purify it; and they shall consecrate themselves.

27 jAnd when these days are expired, it shall be, that upon the eighth day, and so forward, the priests shall make your burnt-offerings upon the altar, and your peaceofferings; and I will accept you, saith the Lord God.

the people, and they shall stand before them to minister unto them.

12 Because they ministered unto them before their idols, and caused the house of Israel to fall into iniquity; therefore have I glifted up mine hand against them, saith the Lord God, and they shall bear their iniquity.

13 hAnd they shall not come near unto me, to do the office of a priest unto me, nor to come near to any of my holy things, in the most holy place: but they shall bear their shame, and their abominations which they have committed.

14 But I will make them 'keepers of the charge of the house, for all the service thereof, and for all that

shall be done therein.

15 But the priests the Levites, the isons of Zadok, that kept the charge of my sanctuary when the children of Israel went astray from me, they shall come near to me to minister unto me, and they kshall stand before me to offer unto me the fat and the blood, saith the Lord GoD:

16 They shall enter into my sanctuary, and they shall come near to my table, to minister unto me, and

they shall keep my charge.

17 And it shall come to pass, that when they enter in at the gates of the inner court, they shall be clothed with linen garments; and no wool shall come upon them, whiles they minister in the gates of

the inner court, and within.

18 mThey shall have linen bonnets upon their heads, and shall have linen breeches upon their loins; they shall not gird themselves with

any thing that causeth sweat. 19 And when they go forth into the utter court, even into the utter court to the people, they shall put off their garments wherein they ministered, and lay them in the holy chambers, and they shall put on other garments; and they shall not sanctify the people with their garments.

20 Neither shall they shave their heads, nor suffer their locks to grow long; they shall only poll their

heads.

21 Neither shall any priest drink wine, when they enter into the

inner court.

22 Neither shall they take for their wives a owidow, nor her that is put away: but they shall take maidens of the seed of the house of Israel, or a widow that had a priest before.

23 And athey shall teach my people the difference between the holy and profane, and cause them to discern between the unclean and the clean.

24 And in bcontroversy they shall stand in judgment; and they shall judge it according to my judgments: and they shall keep my laws and my statutes in all mine assemblies; and they shall hallow my sabbaths.

25 And they shall come at no dead person to defile themselves: but for father, or for mother, or for son, or for daughter, for brother, or for a Ezk.22.26; sister that hath had no husband, they may defile themselves.

26 And after he is cleansed, they b Deut.17.8; shall reckon unto him seven days.

27 And in the day that he goeth into the sanctuary, unto the inner court, to minister in the sanctuary, he shall offer his sin-offering, saith the Lord God.

28 And it shall be unto them for an inheritance: I am their in- Ex.13.2; heritance: and ye shall give them no possession in Israel: I am their f One cubit =

possession.

29 They shall eat the dmeat-offering, and the sin-offering, and the g One ephah trespass-offering; and every dedicated thing in Israel shall be their's.

30 And the first of all the firstfruits of all things, and every oblation of all, of every sort of your oblations, shall be the priest's: ye shall also give unto the priest the first of your dough, that he may cause the blessing to rest in thine j One shekel house.

31 The priests shall not eat of any thing that is dead of itself, or torn, k One gerah = whether it be fowl or beast.

CHAPTER 45.

The Lord's portion of the land.

OREOVER, when ye shall divide by lot the land for inheritance, ye shall offer an oblation unto the LORD, an holy portion of the land: the length shall be the length of five and twenty thousand reeds, and the breadth shall be ten thousand. This shall be holy in all the borders thereof round about.

Of this there shall be for the sanctuary five hundred in length, with five hundred in breadth, square round about; and fifty fcubits round about for the suburbs thereof.

3 And of this measure shalt thou

measure the length of five and twenty thousand, and the breadth of ten thousand: and in it shall be the sanctuary and the most holy place.

4 The holy portion of the land shall be for the priests the ministers of the sanctuary, which shall come near to minister unto the LORD: and it shall be a place for their houses, and an holy place for the sanctuary.

5 And the five and twenty thousand of length, and the ten thousand of breadth, shall also the Levites, the ministers of the house. have for themselves, for a posses-

sion for twenty chambers.

6 And ye shall appoint the possession of the city five thousand broad, and five and twenty thousand long. over against the oblation of the Josh.13.14,33. holy portion: it shall be for the whole house of Israel.

The portion for the prince.

7 And a portion shall be for the prince on the one side and on the other side of the oblation of the holy portion, and of the possession of the city, before the oblation of the holy portion, and before the possession of the city, from the west side westward, and from the east side eastward: and the length shall be over against one of the portions, from the west border unto the east border.

8 In the land shall be his possession in Israel: and my princes shall no more oppress my people; and the rest of the land shall they give to the house of Israel according to

their tribes.

9 Thus saith the Lord GoD; Let it suffice you, O princes of Israel: remove violence and spoil, and execute judgment and justice, take away your exactions from my people, saith the Lord God.

10 Ye shall have just balances, and a just gephah, and a just hbath.

11 The ephah and the bath shall be of one measure, that the bath may contain the tenth part of an homer, and the ephah the tenth part of an homer: the measure thereof shall be after the homer.

12 And the jshekel shall be twenty kgerahs: twenty shekels, five and twenty shekels, fifteen shekels,

shall be your ^lmaneh.

13 This is the oblation that ye shall offer; the sixth part of an ephah of an homer of wheat, and ye shall give the sixth part of an ephah of an homer of barley:

14 Concerning the ordinance of oil, the bath of oil, ye shall offer the tenth part of a bath out of the acor, which is an homer of ten baths; for ten baths are an homer:

15 And one lamb out of the flock, out of two hundred, out of the fat pastures of Israel; for a bmeatoffering, and for a burnt-offering, and for peace-offerings, to make reconciliation for them, saith the Lord God.

16 All the people of the land shall give this oblation for the prince in

Israel.

17 And it shall be the prince's part to give burnt-offerings, and meatofferings, and drink-offerings, in the feasts, and in the new moons, and in the sabbaths, in all solemnities of the house of Israel: he shall prepare the sin-offering, and the meatoffering, and the burnt-offering, and the peace-offerings, to make reconciliation for the house of Israel.

18 Thus saith the Lord God; In die. April; the direct month, in the first day of the month, thou shalt take a young bullock without blemish, and

cleanse the sanctuary:

19 And the priest shall take of the blood of the sin-offering, and put it | f Lev. 4.14. upon the posts of the house, and upon the four corners of the settle of the altar, and upon the posts of the gate of the inner court.

20 And so thou shalt do the seventh day of the month for every h 1 hin = one that erreth, and for him that is simple: so shall ye reconcile the

21 In the first month, in the fourteenth day of the month, ye shall have the passover, a feast of seven days; unleavened bread shall be eaten.

22 And upon that day shall the prince prepare for himself and for all the people of the land a bullock

for a sin-offering.

23 And seven days of the feast he shall prepare a burnt-offering to the LORD, seven bullocks and seven rams without blemish daily the seven days; and a kid of the goats daily for a sin-offering.

24 And he shall prepare a bmeatoffering of an gephah for a bullock, and an ephah for a ram, and an hhin

of oil for an ephah.

25 In the seventh month, in the fifteenth day of the month, shall he do the like in the feast of the seven B.C. 574.

days, according to the sin-offering, according to the burnt-offering. and according to the bmeat-offering. and according to the oil.

CHAPTER 46.

The worship of the prince and the people.

THUS saith the Lord God; The gate of the inner court that looketh toward the east shall be shut the six working days; but on the sabbath it shall be opened, and in the day of the new moon it shall

be opened.

2 And the prince shall enter by the way of the porch of that gate without, and shall stand by the post of the gate, and the priests shall prepare his burnt-offering and his peace-offerings, and he shall worship at the threshold of the gate: then he shall go forth; but the gate shall not be shut until the evening.

3 Likewise the people of the land shall worship at the door of this gate before the LORD in the sabbaths and in the new moons.

4 And the burnt-offering that the prince shall offer unto the LORD in the sabbath day shall be six lambs without blemish, and a ram without blemish.

5 And the bmeat-offering shall be an ephah for a ram, and the meatoffering for the lambs as he shall be able to give, and an hhin of oil to an

ephah.

6 And in the day of the new moon it shall be a young bullock without blemish, and six lambs, and a ram: they shall be without blemish.

7 And he shall prepare a bmeatoffering, an ephah for a bullock, and an ephah for a ram, and for the lambs according as his hand shall attain unto, and an hhin of oil to an ephah.

8 And when the prince shall enter, he shall go in by the way of the porch of that gate, and he shall go

forth by the way thereof.

9 But when the people of the land shall come before the LORD in the solemn feasts, he that entereth in by the way of the north gate to worship shall go out by the way of the south gate; and he that entereth by the way of the south gate shall go forth by the way of the north gate: he shall not return by the way of the gate whereby he came in, but shall go forth over against it.

10 And the prince in the midst of

forth.

11 And in the feasts and in the solemnities the ameat-offering shall be an ephah to a bullock, and an ephah to a ram, and to the lambs as he is able to give, and an bhin of oil to an ephah.

12 Now when the prince shall prepare a voluntary burnt-offering or peace-offerings voluntarily unto the LORD, one shall then open him the gate that looketh toward the east, and he shall prepare his burnt-offering and his peace-offerings, as he did on the sabbath day: then he shall go forth; and after his going forth one shall shut the gate.

13 Thou shalt daily prepare a burnt-offering unto the LORD of a Lit. meal. lamb of the first year without blem- b One hin = ish: thou shalt prepare it every

morning.

14 And thou shalt prepare a ameat-offering for it every morning, d Ezk.45.8. the sixth part of an ephah, and the third part of an bhin of oil, to temper with the fine flour; a meat- f Lev. 2.4,5,7. offering continually by a perpetual ordinance unto the LORD.

15 Thus shall they prepare the lamb, and the ameat-offering, and the oil, every morning for a con- h Ezk. 40.3.

tinual burnt-offering.

16 Thus saith the Lord GoD; If i One cubit = the prince give a gift unto any of his sons, the inheritance thereof shall be his sons'; it shall be their possession by inheritance.

17 But if he give a gift of his inheritance to one of his servants, then it shall be his to 'the year of liberty; after it shall return to the prince: but his inheritance shall be

his sons' for them.

18 Moreover dthe prince shall not take of the people's inheritance by oppression, to thrust them out of their possession; but he shall give his sons inheritance out of his own possession: that my people be not scattered every man from his possession.

The place for boiling the offerings.

19 After he brought me through the entry, which was at the side of the gate, into the holy chambers of the priests, which looked toward the north: and, behold, there was a place on the two sides westward.

20 Then said he unto me. This is the place where the priests shall B.C. 574.

boil the trespass-offering and the sin-offering, where they shall fbake the ameat-offering; that they bear them not out into the utter court. to sanctify the people.

21 Then he brought me forth into the utter court, and caused me to pass by the four corners of the court; and, behold, in every corner of the court there was a court.

22 In the four corners of the court there were courts joined of forty cubits long and thirty broad: these four corners were of one measure.

23 And there was a row of building round about in them, round about them four, and it was made with boiling places under the rows round about.

24 Then said he unto me, These are the places of them that boil, where the ministers of the house shall boil the sacrifice of the people.

CHAPTER 47.

The river of the sanctuary. (Cf. Zech. 14. 8, 9; Rev. 22. 1, 2.)

AFTERWARD he brought me again unto the door of the house; and, behold, gwaters issued out from under the threshold of the house eastward: for the forefront of the house stood toward the east. and the waters came down from under from the right side of the house, at the south side of the

2 Then brought he me out of the way of the gate northward, and led me about the way without unto the utter gate by the way that looketh eastward; and, behold, there ran out waters on the right side.

3 And when hthe man that had the line in his hand went forth eastward, he measured a thousand icubits, and he brought me through the waters; the waters were to the

ankles.

4 Again he measured a thousand. and brought me through the waters; the waters were to the knees. Again he measured a thousand, and brought me through; the waters were to the loins.

5 Afterward he measured a thousand; and it was a river that I could not pass over: for the waters were risen, waters to swim in, a river that could not be passed over.

6 And he said unto me, Son of man, hast thou seen this? Then he brought me, and caused me to return to the brink of the river.

Now when I had returned, behold, at the bank of the river were very many atrees on the one side

and on the other.

8 Then said he unto me, These waters issue out toward the east country, and go down into the desert, and go into the sea: which being brought forth into the sea, the waters shall be healed.

9 And it shall come to pass, that every thing that liveth, which moveth, whithersoever the brivers shall come, shall live: and there shall be a very great multitude of fish, be- a v.12; Rev. cause these waters shall come thither: for they shall be healed; b Heb. two and every thing shall live whither the river cometh.

10 And it shall come to pass, that the fishers shall stand upon it from En-gedi even unto En-eglaim; they shall be a place to spread forth nets; their fish shall be according to their kinds, as the fish of the

great sea, exceeding many.

11 But the miry places thereof and the marishes thereof shall not be f Ezk. 20.5,6, healed; they shall be given to salt.

12 And by the river upon the bank thereof, on this side and on that side, shall grow all trees for meat, dwhose leaf shall not fade, g Ezk.48.1. neither shall the fruit thereof be h Num.34.8. consumed: it shall bring forth new fruit according to his months, be- i2 Sam.8.8 cause their waters they issued out j Ezk.48.1 of the sanctuary: and the fruit thereof shall be for meat, and the leaf thereof for medicine.

The borders of the land. (Cf. Gen. 15. 18-21.)

13 Thus saith the Lord God; This shall be the border, whereby ye shall inherit the land according to the twelve tribes of Israel: 'Joseph

shall have two portions.

14 And ye shall inherit it, one as well as another: concerning the which I flifted up mine hand to give it unto your fathers: and this land shall fall unto you for inheritance.

15 And this shall be the border of the land toward the north side, from the great sea, gthe way of Hethlon, as men go to ^hZedad:

16 hHamath, Berothah, Sibraim, which is between the border of Damascus and the border of Hamath; Hazar-hatticon, which is by the coast of Hauran.

17 And the border from the sea shall be 'Hazar-enan, the border of

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Damascus, and the north northward, and the border of Hamath. And this is the north side.

18 And the east side ye shall measure from Hauran, and from Da-mascus, and from Gilead, and from the land of Israel by Jordan, from the border unto the east sea. And this is the east side.

19 And the south side southward. from Tamar even to kthe waters of strife in Kadesh, the river to the great sea. And this is the south

side southward.

20 The west side also shall be the great sea from the border, till a man come over against Hamath.

This is the west side.

21 So shall ye divide this land unto you according to the tribes of Israel. 22 And it shall come to pass, that ye shall divide it by lot for an inheritance unto you, land to the strangers that sojourn among you, which shall beget children among you: and "they shall be unto you as born in the country among the children of Israel; they shall have inheritance with you among the tribes of Israel.

23 And it shall come to pass, that in what tribe the stranger sojourneth, there shall ye give him his inheritance, saith the Lord GoD.

CHAPTER 48.

The division of the land. (Cf. Josh. 13. 1-19. 51.)

NOW these are the names of the tribes. "From the north end to the coast of the way of Hethlon, as one goeth to Hamath, Hazarenan, the border of Damascus northward, to the coast of Hamath; for these are his sides east and west; a portion for Dan.

2 And by the border of Dan, from the east side unto the west side, a

portion for Asher.

3 And by the border of Asher, from the east side even unto the west side, a portion for Naphtali. 4 And by the border of Naphtali,

from the east side unto the west side, a portion for Manasseh. 5 And by the border of Manasseh,

from the east side unto the west side, a portion for Ephraim. 6 And by the border of Ephraim.

from the east side even unto the

west side, a portion for Reuben. 7 And by the border of Reuben, from the east side unto the west side, a portion for Judah.

8 And by the border of Judah, from the east side unto the west side, shall be athe offering which ye shall offer of five and twenty thousand reeds in breadth, and in length as one of the other parts. from the east side unto the west side: and the sanctuary shall be in the midst of it.

9 The oblation that ye shall offer unto the LORD shall be of five and twenty thousand in length, and of

ten thousand in breadth.

For the priests and Levites.

10 And for them, even for the priests, shall be this holy oblation; toward the north five and twenty thousand in length, and toward the west ten thousand in breadth, a Ezk. 45.1-6. and toward the east ten thousand in breadth, and toward the south five b Ezk.44.15. and twenty thousand in length: and the sanctuary of the LORD shall be in the midst thereof.

11 bIt shall be for the priests that are sanctified of the sons of Zadok; e Ezk.42.20. which have kept my charge, which went not astray when the children f Ezk. 45.7. of Israel went astray, cas the Le-

vites went astray.

12 And this oblation of the land h Heb. one that is offered shall be unto them a thing most holy by the border of i Ezk.47.19.

the Levites.

13 And over against the border of bah-Kadesh the priests the Levites shall have five and twenty thousand in length. k Ezk.47.14, and ten thousand in breadth: all the length shall be five and twenty thousand, and the breadth ten thousand.

14 dAnd they shall not sell of it. neither exchange, nor alienate the firstfruits of the land: for it is holy

unto the LORD.

15 And the five thousand, that are left in the breadth over against the five and twenty thousand, shall be a eprofane place for the city, for dwelling, and for suburbs: and the city shall be in the midst thereof.

16 And these shall be the measures thereof: the north side four thousand and five hundred, and the south side four thousand and five hundred, and on the east side four thousand and five hundred, and the west side four thousand and five hundred.

17 And the suburbs of the city shall be toward the north two hundred and fifty, and toward the south two hundred and fifty, and toward the east two hundred and

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fifty, and toward the west two hundred and fifty.

18 And the residue in length over against the oblation of the holy portion shall be ten thousand eastward, and ten thousand westward; and it shall be over against the oblation of the holy portion; and the increase thereof shall be for food unto them that serve the city.

19 And they that serve the city shall serve it out of all the tribes of

Israel.

20 All the oblation shall be five and twenty thousand by five and twenty thousand: ye shall offer the holy oblation foursquare, with the possession of the city.

The portion for the prince.

21 fAnd the residue shall be for the prince, on the one side and on the other of the holy oblation, and of the possession of the city, over against the five and twenty thousand of the oblation toward the east border, and westward over against the five and twenty thousand toward the west border, over against the portions for the prince: and it shall be the holy oblation: gand the sanctuary of the house shall be in the midst thereof.

22 Moreover from the possession of the Levites, and from the possession of the city, being in the midst of that which is the prince's, between the border of Judah and the border of Benjamin, shall be for

the prince.

23 As for the rest of the tribes, from the east side unto the west side. Benjamin shall have a hportion.

24 And by the border of Benjamin, from the east side unto the west side, Simeon shall have a portion.

25 And by the border of Simeon. from the east side unto the west side, Issachar a portion.

26 And by the border of Issachar, from the east side unto the west side, Zebulun a portion.

27 And by the border of Zebulun, from the east side unto the west side, Gad a portion.

28 And by the border of Gad, at

the south side southward, the border shall be even from Tamar unto the iwaters of istrife in Kadesh, and to the river toward the great sea.

29 kThis is the land which ye shall divide by lot unto the tribes of Israel for inheritance, and these are their portions, saith the Lord GoD.
